

Order on quantum of sentence.

Present:- Shri S.K. Goindwal, Advocate for complainant.
Convict Jeevan Singh on bail, represented by Shri Neeraj Rajoria, Advocate.

Order:-

This order shall form part of my above judgment.

2. I have heard ld. counsel for the complainant and the ld. defence counsel on question of sentence.

3 Ld. defence counsel submitted that convict belongs to a poor family and he is unemployed and he has two children. He further stated that he is not a previous convict and a prayer for taking lenient view qua convict is made. Statement of the accused/convict in this regard also recorded separately.

4. On the other hand, ld. counsel for the complainant submitted that since commission of offence has been duly proved, therefore, maximum sentence be awarded to the convict.

5. After hearing the respective submissions made by the learned counsel for the convict and complainant, this court is of the considered opinion that accused is not entitled for benefit of probation because he is involved in offence pertaining to dishonour of cheque. Further, the convict is also not entitled for the lenient view because offence pertaining to dishonour of cheque, causes incalculable loss, injury and inconvenience to the payee. Since the transaction pertains to the year 2020, therefore, convict is sentenced to **simple imprisonment for six months** and the complainant is awarded compensation to the tune of **Rs.65,000/- (Rs.**

Sixty Five Thousand Rupees Only) to be paid by the convict to the complainant for loss and injury suffered by him, **within 60 days** and **in default, convict shall further undergo simple imprisonment for one month.** It is however, made clear that the period, if any, undergone by the convict during the trial of the present case be set off against the sentence. It is further made clear that **the amount, if any, already paid by the convict to the complainant during the trial of the present case, be set off from the amount of compensation.** Compensation amount to the tune of **Rs.65,000/- (Rs. Sixty Five Thousand Rupees Only)** has not been paid by **the convict.** Copy of judgment supplied to the convict free of cost. File, after due compliance, be consigned to record room.
