The right of hearing the proposed accused at the stage of pre cognizance is dispensed with.

Perusal of the file reveals that all the technical requirements u/s 138 of the NI Act have been met with. Furthermore, the complaint is within the period of limitation.

Pre-summoning evidence by way of affidavit and other annexed documents perused. This court finds sufficient material to proceed ahead with the case at hand. I take cognizance of the offence punishable u/s 138 NI Act.

Following the law laid down in *A. C. Narayanan Vs. State of Maharashtra & Anr.* (2014) 11 SCC 790, complaint, pre-summoning evidence by way of affidavit and other documents considered. In view of the same, there are sufficient grounds for proceeding further against accused Ramanjeet Kaur, for offence punishable under Section 138 N. I. Act.

There is no need to issue summons in the matter as the accused is already aware of the proceedings.

Since the offence is bailable, accused is admitted to bail subject to furnishing of Bail Bonds in the sum of Rs. 30,000/- , with one surety of like amount .

Ld. Counsel for accused seeks time to furnish the bail bonds. Heard and time granted.

Let copy of complaint be supplied to Ld. Counsel for the accused.

Let fresh vakalatnama be filed by Ld. Counsel for the accused on the NDOH.

Be put up for furnishing of bail bonds and framing of NOA on 08.12.2026.

Complainant is directed to furnish all the previous ordersheets in the matter.
