ORDER BELOW EXH.1

The applicant/accused by name Rohidas @ Rohit Tryambak Shete has moved this application for regular bail in C.R.No.40/2026 registered by the Shirpur City Police Station, for the offences punishable under Section – 109, 132, 121(1), 303(2) and 352 r/w.3(5) of the B.N.S. and Section – 48(7) of M.L.R.C..

2. Perused the application, say thereon filed by the State and the police papers. Heard both sides.

3. It is the story of the State that the informant by name Mahendra Laxman Patil was working as the circle officer in the Tahsil office, Shirpur. He was entrusted with the duty to take action against illegal mining of minor minerals. So also, Ranjit Jogdand, Rahul Gunwante, S.PMahajan, N.S.Patel, Jayesh Rajput, Mahesh Savle, Ganesh Bagul, Yogesh Patil, Ravikiran Dhudku Malich, Vijay Pandit Pawar and Vishal Koli were the members in his team headed by him.

4. On 31.01.2026 at about 10.00 a.m., the informant and his team went to national highway No.3, Shahada fata, near Kasturi hotel for taking the action against the person, who were mining and transporting the sand. At about 10.45 a.m., one hiwa

vehicle was coming towards Kalmsare town. They found that there was sand in that hiwa vehicle. They gave indication to the driver of the said vehicle to stop. They gave their introduction to the driver of the said vehicle and asked his name and description. At that time the driver of his vehicle tried to take the said vehicle on the body of informant and his team. Thereafter, the driver of said vehicle i.e. accused No.4 took the U-turn of the said vehicle and ran towards Chopda T-point. The informant and his team chased the said vehicle and caught it near Bharat Petroleum near Chopda T-point. They asked accused No.4 his name and address, but he did not answer. They asked about the royalty in respect of sand in the said vehicle. But, accused No.4 had no document. After sometime, the applicant/accused, co-accused Vicky @ Chetan Chaudhari and Amol Shete came there and asked to release the vehicle. They asked accused No.4 to take away the said vehicle. The accused persons rushed on the body of Mahesh Sable and manhandled him. They pressed the neck of Mahesh Sable and tried to kill him. They asked accused No.4 to take the vehicle and if someone came in a way of that vehicle, then took the vehicle from his body. At that time accused No.4 took the vehicle on the body of the informant and his team to kill them. The said vehicle was taken away by accused No.4.

5. The learned advocate for applicant/accused has submitted that the allegations in the F.I.R. are vague. The applicant/accused is falsely implicated in this case. There were 11 persons in the team of informant. Therefore, it is not possible that those

11 persons could not handle four accused persons. The applicant/accused is in custody since more than 35 days. He is ready to abide the terms and conditions of the bail. Hence, he be released on bail.

6. On the other hand, the learned A.P.P. has argued that this offence is grave and serious. The sand is yet to be recovered. The accused assaulted the public servants and tried to kill them. If he will release on the bail, he will commit the same type of offence. The investigation is going on. Hence, this application is to be rejected.

7. After considering the submissions made by both sides, the applicant/ accused is in custody since 38 days. The trial will take its own time. He is ready to abide the terms and conditions of bail. Therefore, considering all these things, the accused is entitled for bail by imposing the stringent conditions. Hence, I proceed to pass the following order.

ORDER

1. The application is allowed.
2. Accused Rohidas @ Rohit Tryambak Shete be released on bail in C.R.No.40/2026 registered by the Shirpur City Police Station, for the offences punishable under Section – 109, 132, 121(1), 303(2) and 352 r/w.3(5) of the B.N.S. and Section – 48(7) of M.L.R.C., on executing P.R. bond of Rs.50,000/- with one surety in the like amount.
3. The applicant/accused shall attend the Shirpur police station on every Monday in between 11.00 a.m. to 03.00 p.m. till filing of the chargesheet.

4. The applicant shall not directly or indirectly tamper the prosecution evidence.
5. The applicant shall not commit similar type of offence.
6. In case of breach of any condition, the prosecution may move the application for the cancellation of bail.
