



ORDER BELOW EXH. 1 IN
REGULAR CRIMINAL CASE NO. 183/1998

Perused the record. The charge-sheet is filed against the accused for the offences punishable under section 384 r.w. 34 of Indian Penal Code. The accused are absconding since long. The charge is not framed against the accused. The non-bailable warrants issued against the accused were returned unserved and as such the presence of accused could not be secured. Therefore, the witness summons were issued to all the prosecution witnesses for recording their evidence under section 299 of Code of Criminal Procedure. But as per the witness report the informant and other witnesses are not traceable except the spot panch Rajendra Sahadeo Mahale. The spot witness who is not supporting the case of prosecution. The case is more than 25 years old and lingering without any progress. There is no possibility that the accused and the witness will found in near future. Accordingly, no evidence against the accused is come on record. In such a circumstances, it is not just and proper to keep this case pending for an indefinite period without any progress at the cost of public. Therefore, there is no alternative except to discharge the accused. Hence, the accused are required to be discharged. In the result, following order is passed :

ORDER

1. The accused are discharged for the offences punishable under section 384 r/w 34 of Indian Penal Code.

2. Bail bonds of accused is cancelled.
3. The standing warrant issued against accused stand cancelled.
4. The seized muddemal i.e. receipt books are worthless, hence be destroyed after the appeal period is over.
