

**ORDER BELOW EXH. 1 IN R.C.C. No.****12/2010**State of Maharashtra Vs.
Suresh Dattu Patil etc. 4

This is the case for offences punishable u/s. 323, 325, 504, 506 r/w. 34 of the Indian Penal Code, 1860. However, my Ld. Predecessor framed charge against accused persons for offence punishable u/s. 326, r/w. 34 of the Indian Penal Code, 1860 in addition.

2. Till the date, the prosecution could examine in all six witnesses, however, evidence of the I.O. i.e. P.W. 6 could not be completed as the I.O. did not bring the case diary on the designated date and consequently, his evidence is recorded partly. That, on 05/10/2011 the case was adjourned till next date. The I.O. was bound to appear before the Court along with case diary on next date by his own, however, he did not. In such circumstance, instead of issuing witness summons again in the name of the I.O., considering age of the case, it is appropriate to issue B.W. against the said witness i.e. P.W.6. Hence, following order.

ORDER

Issue B.W. against the P.W.6 in terms of Rs.5,000/-.

The P.S.O. of the Police Station, Chandgad is directed to execute the warrant on the witness by his best endeavor by appointing special police constable for this purpose.
