



**ORDER BELOW EXH.01 IN R.C.S.NO.224/2012**  
**[Sadashiv Yallappa Koli v. Sagar Ramu Aambi (deceased)**  
**through Lrs.]**

The plaintiff, defendants, learned advocate Shri. D.D.Magdum for the plaintiff and learned advocate Shri. S.J.Chougule for defendants are present before the Court. The suit was referred for mediation to the Hon'ble Trained Mediator Judge. In view of report (Exh.75) of Hon'ble Trained Mediator Judge, both the parties have amicably settled the dispute in mediation.

02. The plaintiff has filed withdrawal pursis (Exh.76). Contents of withdrawal pursis (Exh.76) were read over and explained to the plaintiff. He has voluntarily admitted correctness of contents of said pursis. He submitted at bar that, the dispute between both the parties has been amicably settled in mediation and hence, he does not want to proceed against defendants. He voluntarily wants to withdraw the suit. He lastly prayed that, in view of withdrawal pursis (Exh.76), the suit may be disposed of.

03. Defendants, learned advocate Shri. D.D.Magdum and learned advocate Shri. S.J.Chougule for defendants supported to submissions of the plaintiff. They submitted at bar that, the dispute between both the parties has been amicably settled in mediation and hence, the plaintiff does not want to proceed further against defendants. Hence, they prayed that, the suit may be disposed of as withdrawn.

04. Considering contents of report (Exh.75) and withdrawal pursis (Exh.76) as well as submissions of the plaintiff,

defendants, learned advocate Shri. D.D.Magdum and learned advocate Shri. S.J.Chougule it shows that, the dispute between both the parties has been amicably settled in mediation. It further shows that, the plaintiff does not want to proceed with the present suit. He voluntarily and unconditionally wants to withdraw the suit. Hence, withdrawal pursis (Exh.76) came to be read and recorded as per order passed thereon. In view of above peculiar facts and circumstances, it would be just and proper to dispose of present suit as per withdrawal pursis (Exh.76). Accordingly, I pass following order :-

**:: ORDER ::**

1. In view of withdrawal pursis (Exh.76), the suit is disposed of as withdrawn.
2. Court-fees be refunded to the plaintiff as per rule.
