



ORDER BELOW EXH.01 IN REGULAR DARKHAST No.24/2014
[Aanna Narasu Magdum and Anr. v. Shamrao Gunda Magdum
and Ors.]

Decree-holders and their learned advocate are present before the Court. Decree-holders have filed withdrawal pursis (Exh.34) contending that, the darkhast may be disposed of as fully satisfied.

02. Contents of withdrawal pursis (Exh.34) were read over and explained to decree-holders. They have voluntarily admitted correctness of contents of said pursis. They submitted at bar that, decree-holders have received possession of suit property 1(B) and suit property 1(C) from judgment-debtors. Hence, they do not want to proceed further against judgment-debtors. They lastly prayed that, in view of withdrawal pursis (Exh.34), the darkhast may be disposed of. Learned advocate for decree-holders supported to submissions of decree-holders.

03. In view of submissions of decree-holders, their learned advocate and report submitted by the Deputy Superintendent of Land Record, Shirol vide Exh.33 as well as considering contents in withdrawal pursis (Exh.34) it shows that, decree-holders have received possession of suit property 1(B) and suit property 1(C) from judgment-debtors and hence, the darkhast is fully satisfied. Therefore, decree-holders have voluntarily filed withdrawal pursis (Exh.34). Considering above peculiar facts and circumstances, withdrawal pursis (Exh.34) came to be read and recorded. Hence, in view of above discussion, it is just and proper to dispose of present darkhast as per withdrawal pursis (Exh.34). Accordingly, I pass following order :-

:: ORDER ::

In view of pursis (Exh.34), the darkhast is disposed of as fully satisfied.
