PRE-SITTING LOK ADALAT

Present : Ld. Addl.PP for the State.
Accused in person alongwith Ld. Counsel.

Accused has filed an application seeking Plea-bargaining along with the requisite affidavit. As per previous conviction report of the accused, he is not previously convicted for the same or similar offence.

Ld. Addl.PP accepts the notice on behalf of State. Heard. Record perused. Let the accused be examined in Camera.

After examining the accused in-Camera, this court is satisfied that the application for Plea-Bargaining has been filed by accused voluntarily and without any undue pressure or coercion.

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Accused, Ld. Addl.PP for State and IO after having meeting to enter a mutually satisfactory disposition of the case have reported to the Court that a mutually satisfactory disposition of the case has been worked out between the parties, wherein accused voluntarily agrees to plead guilty for offence u/S 223 (a) BNS and Addl.PP for State & IO have raised no objection for the same and that the accused has agreed that he shall not repeat the offence in future and that the accused shall undergo the punishment as will be imposed by the court.

Separate statements of the accused have been recorded which are annexed with this order.

Court has heard the mutual satisfactory disposition of case worked out by the parties, the process of which has been completed voluntarily by the parties. Court is satisfied that there is no impediment to dispose of the present case through plea-bargaining.

In view of the mutual satisfactory disposal of the case upon the application moved on behalf of accused for plea-bargaining, accused stands convicted for the offence punishable u/S 223 (a) BNS.

Submissions on the point of sentence heard.

In the facts and circumstance of the present case, the convict is admonished as per the provisions of Section 3 of Probation of Offenders Act.

Let the file be put up before Lok Adalat for disposal on **12.09.2026**.
