This petition has come before me on 25-03-2026 for final hearing in the presence of **Sri G. Srinivasa Rao**, Advocate for Petitioners and the Respondent Nil, upon perusing the material available on record and the matter having stood over for consideration till this day, this Court delivers the following :

ORDER

This petition is filed by the petitioners 1 and 2 under Section 13-B of Hindu Marriage Act, 1955 to pass a decree of divorce by mutual consent

dissolving the marriage of the petitioners solemnized on 10-02-2023.

2. The averments of the petition in brief are that :

The Petitioners are the husband and wife and their marriage was performed on 10-02-2023 at Kshatriya Kalyana Mandapam, L.R. Peta, Palakollu as per Hindu rites and caste customs. Their marriage was consummated. During their wedlock no children were born to them. After marriage 1st petitioner went to the parents house of 2nd petitioner for nuptial function. Subsequently, 1st petitioner bring the 2nd petitioner to his house at Palakollu to lead marital life. Petitioners 1 and 2 lead marital life one year only, during that period some misunderstandings arose between them. The 1st petitioner raised dispute before family elders at Jinnuru before whom petitioners 1 and 2 expressed their unwillingness to lead their marital life and they expressed their dislike towards each other. Since March, 2024 petitioners 1 and 2 have been living separately. Several efforts were made through elders for their reunion but in vain. There is no possibility of their reunion.

ii) As per understanding, the 1st petitioner agreed to pay an amount of Rs.1,50,000/- to the 2nd petitioner towards her permanent alimony at the time of granting divorce. The 2nd petitioner agreed that she should not claim any maintenance or anything in future from the 1st petitioner. Accordingly, petitioners 1 and 2 mutually agreed to dissolve their marriage by decree of divorce. Hence, the petition.

3. Heard the counsel for petitioners.

4. The point for consideration is :

Whether the petitioners are entitled for decree of divorce by mutual consent dissolving the marriage of the petitioners 1 and 2 ?

5. POINT:

To prove the claim of the petitioners, the petitioners 1 and 2 got examined themselves as P.W.1 and 2 respectively and got exhibited Exs.P-1 to Ex.P-3 documents. Ex.P-1 is wedding card of the petitioners 1 and 2 dated 10-02-2023. Ex.P-2 is marriage photographs of petitioners 1 and 2 (two in number) and Ex.P-3 is the photostat copy of Aadhar card of the 1st petitioner (compared with original).

6. Petitioners 1 and 2 filed their chief-examination affidavits as P.W.1 and 2 respectively and Exs.P-1 to Ex.P-3 are exhibited through P.W.1. P.W.1 and 2 reiterated the petition averments in their chief-examination. As per the averments of petition and the evidence of P.Ws.1 and 2, as per understanding, the 1st petitioner paid an amount of Rs.1,50,000/- to the 2nd petitioner towards her permanent alimony. The 2nd petitioner agreed that she should not claim any maintenance or anything in future from the 1st petitioner. Accordingly, petitioners 1 and 2 mutually agreed to dissolve their marriage by decree of divorce. During their wedlock no children were born to them. Ex.P-1 is wedding card of the petitioners 1 and 2 dated 10-02-2023. Ex.P-2 is marriage photographs of petitioners 1 and 2 (two in number) and Ex.P-3 is the photostat copy of Aadhar card of the 1st petitioner (compared with original). From the averments of petition and evidence of P.W.1 and P.W.2 and Exs.P-1 to Ex.P-3 it is obvious that the petitioners 1 and 2 filed this petition with mutual consent and out of their own will and accord.

7. Thus, in the facts and circumstances of the case, in the light of the evidence let in and for the foregoing reasons, it is held that the petitioners are entitled for decree of divorce by mutual consent dissolving the marriage of the petitioners from the date of decree. Accordingly, this point is answered.

8. **In the result**, the petition is allowed, granting decree of divorce by mutual consent under Section 13-B of Hindu Marriage Act, dissolving the marriage of the petitioners 1 and 2 solemnized on 10-02-2023, without costs.
