Apprehending their arrest in Crime No. 46 of 2026,
registered with Bhagyanagar Police Station for the offences
punishable under Sections 316(2), 316(5), 318(4), 336(3), 3(5) of

the Bhartiya Nyaya Sanhita, 2023 (in short 'BNS'), applicants have filed the present application for pre-arrest bail under Section 482 of the Bhartiya Nagrik Suraksha Sanhita, 2023 (in short 'BNSS').

2. Perused application and reply of Investigating Officer below Exh. 06.

3. Heard Learned advocate for the applicant and learned APP for the State.

4. The case of prosecution is that the informant is Inspector / Auditor of S.T Co-operative Bank. In December 2025, when he audited the record of S.T Co-operative Bank Nanded, he found that the office bearers have disbursed loan illegally more than permissible limit. They prepared fabricated vouchers, deposited amount in the account of borrowers and withdrawn the amount for themselves. Accordingly they deceived the bank and misappropriated amount of Rs. 1,09,14,521/-.

5. The Ld. Advocate for the applicants submits that the applicant No.1 is a driver and applicant No.2 is a Mechanic working in S.T Department. They do not have any role and authority in sanction or disbursement of the loan. Co-accused having same role have been released on bail by the Hon'ble High Court. The applicants have already repaid the amount. Therefore, they may be protected from arrest. They are ready to co-operate the investigation and abide by all the terms and conditions.

6. Ld. APP strongly opposed for pre-arrest bail stating that applicants have misappropriated total amount of Rs. 5,00,000/-. Investigation is going on. There is prima facie case and evidence against the present applicants. The misappropriated amount is to be recovered from the applicants. Therefore, custodial interrogation of the applicants is necessary.

7. Perused case papers. Basic allegation is that the office bearers of the bank prepared document of illegal sanction and disbursed loan amount more than what was permitted and then withdrawn the amount from the account of borrowers. The applicants claims to be driver and mechanic working in S.T Department. Same is not disputed at this stage. FIR alleges that excess amount of Rs. 4,00,000/- was sanctioned in favour of applicant No.1 and excess amount of Rs. 1,00,000/- was sanctioned in favour of applicant No.2. The applicant No.1 claims that he has repaid amount of Rs. 3,20,000/- and applicant No.2 has paid entire amount of Rs. 1,00,000/-. It appears that the applicants are the employees of MSRTC who have availed loan facility from co-operative bank. The allegations regarding sanctioning of loan beyond permissible limit is against the director and office bearers and not against the employees. Ld. Advocate for applicant has placed on record copy of order dated 20-02-2026 and 11-03-2026 passed by the Hon'ble High Court. These orders show that co-accused who are alleged to have same role in present offence, are released on anticipatory bail. Nothing is shown or produced by the prosecution to distinguish the role of the present applicant than the

accused to whom anticipatory bail is granted by the Hon'ble High Court. In these circumstances, the arrest and custodial interrogation of the applicants may not be necessary. Hence, following order :-

ORDER

1. In the event of the arrest of applicants, they be released on bail on their executing P.R. Bond of **Rs.50,000/- each** with solvent surety in the like amount, on following conditions:
 - a) Applicants shall attend the I.O on 22-06-2026 in between 10.00 am to 2.00 pm and thereafter as and when called by the I.O under written intimation till filing of the charge-sheet or till 60 days from today, whichever is earlier.
 - b) Applicants shall co-operate the investigation.
 - c) Applicants shall not tamper with the prosecution evidence.
 2. Inform the concerned Police Station accordingly.
