State vs Ashokan and Ors.

**Order below Exh.18**

Accused No.2 is brought before me in consequence of execution of non-bailable warrant. She is remanded to Magisterial custody. She has filed present application for releasing on cash security.

2. Heard Ld counsel for accused No.2 and perused record.

3. It is seen that as per order dated 16.02.2019, below Exh.4 this accused was released on bail on executing P.R. bond and surety bond of Rs.15,000/-. Accordingly, she has furnished P.R. bond and surety bond. As she remained absent continuously since prior to February, 2022, non-bailable warrant was issued against her. In the present application, she has failed to mention any ground for her long absence. As she is arrested and brought before the court in execution of non-bailable warrant, her earlier bail bonds stand forfeited. Therefore, she cannot be released on bail unless she pay her bond amount towards forfeiture. The Ld. Counsel for the accused submits that she would regularly attend the trial in future. Considering this assurance and accused being a woman, it would be just and proper to release her on bail subject to payment of amount of her personal bond towards forfeiture. Hence, the order-

**ORDER**

Accused No.2 is released on fresh personal bond of Rs.7,000/- and on depositing cash security of Rs.5,000/- subject to condition that she shall pay amount of her previous personal bond i.e. Rs.15,000/- towards forfeiture.
