ORDER

The particulars of offence punishable under Section 285 of the Bharatiya Nyay Sanhita, 2023 alleged to have been committed by accused was read over and explained to accused, upon which the accused admitted his guilt that he has parked his vehicle in a manner so as to cause obstruction to the public way of navigation. So also, the extent of punishment prescribed for the aforesaid offence is made clear to accused, upon which he submitted that he is ready to undergo the punishment imposed by this Court. I considered his submissions and found his plea volunteer. Hence considering the nature of offence, I accept it and hold accused guilty for offence under Section 285 of the Bharatiya Nyay Sanhita, 2023. Accused prayed for leniency. He has submitted that he is a poor person, therefore lenient view may kindly be taken. Perused record. There are no antecedents of accused showing his involvement in any other crime. Hence, considering the nature of offence and submissions of accused, lenient view is required to be taken. In view of the discussion noted above, I proceed to pass following order:-

ORDER

1. Accused is hereby convicted for the offence punishable under section 285 of the Bharatiya Nyay Sanhita, 2023 and he is sentenced to pay fine of Rs.400/- (Rupees Four Hundred Only), in default to suffer simple imprisonment for one day.
2. Matter stands finally disposed of.
