J U D G M E N T

(Delivered on this 24th July, 2026)

1. Accused Nos. 1 and 2 are stands prosecuted for the offence punishable under **Section 12A of the Maharashtra Prevention of Gambling Act, 1887**. Accused appeared before court. Particulars are read over and explained to them in vernacular. Accused has voluntarily pleaded guilty vide pursis Exh. 04. I have verified about the voluntariness of their plea. Hence, accused deserves to be convicted.

2. I have heard the accused on the point of quantum of sentence. they submitted that they are only bread earning member of their family. Hence, prayed for leniency and minimum fine. After considering facts and circumstances of the case, I pass following order :-

O R D E R

The Accused Nos. 1 and 2 are convicted for the offence **under Section 12A of the Maharashtra Prevention of Gambling Act, 1887** and they are sentenced to suffer TRC and a fine of **₹300/- (Rupees Three Hundred only) each** and in default to suffer simple imprisonment for 7 days. The playing card etc. are worthless hence it be disposed off as per law after an appeal period is over, The amount of Rs. 3000/- be credited to Government account an after appeal period over. Case papers be filed.
