**Resumed on Solemn affirmation today -**

**Further examination-in-chief by P.P. Shri. S.B. Jadhavar continued -**

10           The said two currency notes of denomination of Rs.500/- each were checked in the light of ultra violent lamp by covering black cloth and those were found shining. Thereafter both the hands of Gadade were checked in the light of ultra violent lamp by covering black cloth and those were found shining. The shirt of Gadade was checked in the light of ultra violent lamp by covering black cloth and the left side inner both sides of the pocket were found shining.

11           Thereafter the hands of employees who had caught the hands of Gadade, were checked in the light of ultra violent lamp by covering black cloth but those were not found shining. Before setting the trap the description of the two currency notes, which were decided to be given as bribe, were noted down on a blank paper. The said description which marked as Exh.26 is now shown to me. It is the same. It bears my signature, signatures of another panch and Dy.S.P. Gawade. The Dy.S.P. Gawade gave me the said description to read it. The description of the notes which were written before trap and the description of the currency notes which were found in the pocket of Gadade were same and it was shown to the accused. Both the hands of

Panch No.2 Jadhav were checked in the light of ultra violent lamp by covering black cloth and those were found shining. The anthracene powder was applied to the currency notes found in the left pocket of the shirt of Gadade and those currency notes removed by Panch No.2 Jadhav by his hand, so his hands were found shining in the light of ultra violet lamp.

12           The said currency notes were kept in a green coloured envelop and envelop was sealed and labelled. Before keeping, the notes in the envelop, the envelop was checked in the light of ultra violent lamp by covering black cloth and it was not found shining. Thereafter Dy.S.P. Gawade asked the panch No.2 Jadhav to wash his hand. I can identify the said currency notes if shown to me.

**Note:-** The sealed envelop is opened before the witness, P.P., advocate Shri. Nalegaonkar for accused and the accused and the notes found in it are shown to the witness.

13           The two currency notes of denomination of Rs.500/- each bearing No. ANU919629 and 9BQ916369, now shown to me are the same. Those are marked as Muddemal object No.1 and 2 respectively. The label of envelop bears my signature, signatures of another panch and Dy.S.P.Gawade. I identify the signatures. The envelop is marked as MO-3.

14           Dy.S.P. Gawade asked me take search of the person of Gadade. Accordingly I took the search. At that time he had worn faint purple coloured shirt and brown coloured pant. One mobile handset, a handkerchief and key of a vehicle was found

in right pocket of his pant. Nothing was found in the pocket of his shirt. A wallet was found in the back side pocket of his pant. An amount of Rs.2600/- was found in the said wallet. An Adhar Card, Pan Card and other documents were found in the wallet. On these articles were checked in the light of ultra violent lamp by covering black cloth and those were not found shining. Those articles and amount was returned to the accused. Accused Gadade was taken by the side and the complainant Chaudhari was called. I was asked to take search of his person. His both hands were checked in the light of ultra violent lamp by covering black cloth and the figures of his right hand were found shining.

15           Thereafter I took search of the person of the complainant. I found that he had worn faint coloured purple of shirt. Nothing was found in the right side pocket of his pant. One mobile handset, a handkerchief and key of vehicle was found in the left pocket of his pant. An Amount of Rs.220/-, Pan card, Adhar card and other documents were found in his watch pocket. The said articles and amount were checked in the light of ultra violent lamp by covering black cloth and those were not found shining. The said amount and articles were returned to him.

16           The pant of complainant Choudhari was checked in the light of ultra violet lamp by covering a black cloth and the inner sides of the right pocket were found shining. On inquiry, Gadade told that the relevant documents i.e. application for E.L. and other documents were at Malumbra office. Thereafter our

team alongwith complainant and accused proceeded towards Malumbra. The Dy. Executive Engineer produced the inward and outward registers of Malumbra as well as of Tuljapur. He also produced the attendance register of Sub-center Kati. The copies of relevant pages of these registers were taken and the original registers were taken to him. The relevant pages were signed by me, another panch and by Dy.S.P. Gawade. Dy. Executive Engineer signed it as true copies. Those are now shown to me. Those are the same. Those are at **Exh.46, 47, 48, 49 and 50** respectively. Thereafter we all returned to the scene of incidence. As there was heavy traffic we came to Tuljapur Police Station.

17           When we reached Tuljapur Police Station, Dy.S.P. Gawade telephoned the nephew of the accused and asked him to bring a shirt of the accused. Accordingly, he came with his T-shirt. Thereafter the Gadade was asked to remove the shirt which he had worn at the time of raid. Accordingly he removed his shirt and gave it to me. I folded it and it was placed in a green coloured envelop. Before that, the envelop was checked in the light of ultra violent lamp by covering black cloth and it was not found shining. The envelop was sealed and labelled. Thereafter myself, another panch and Dy.S.P. Gawade signed on it. I can identify the shirt as well as envelop and label if shown to me.

**Note:-** The sealed envelop is opened before the witness, P.P., advocate Shri. Nalegaonkar for accused and the accused and the shirt found in it is shown to the witness.

18            The shirt now shown to me is the same. It is marked as Muddemal object No.4. The label of envelop bears my signature, signatures of another panch and Dy.S.P.Gawade. I identify the signatures. The envelop is marked as MO-5.

**Further examination-in-chief is differ due to court time is over.**
