The petitioners, the counsel for petitioners and the counsel for respondent No.2 also present and they have filed Joint Memo agreeing to settle the matter for **Rs.43,00,000/- (Rupees Forty Three Lakhs only)** as full and final settlement amount.

The counsel for petitioners identified the petitioners. The identification of petitioners are verified by going through the original Aadhar card and verifying the details of residence by asking orally.

Both the parties have signed the Joint memo.

The compromise is lawful and not oppose to public policy and it is beneficial to petitioners. Hence it can be accepted. As such we proceed to pass the following:

ORDER

The petition is allowed in terms of Joint Memo filed by the parties.

The Joint memo shall form part and parcel of the award.

The **respondent No.2** is hereby directed to pay the agreed amount of **Rs.43,00,000/- (Rupees Forty Three Lakhs only)** within two months from the date of this order.

Petitioner No.1 is wife of the deceased filed affidavit stating that she do not have any objection to allot Rs.33,00,000/- in the name of petitioner No.2 who is a son of the deceased and Rs.10,00,000/- allotted to petitioner No.4 she is

daughter of deceased and she is residing in her husband's house.

Out of the award amount, Rs.33,00,000/- is allotted to the petitioner No.2, out of this amount 70% shall be released through E-payment directly to the account of the petitioner No.2 by obtaining his account details, remaining 30% shall be kept in FD in any nationalized or schedule bank for the period of 3 years in the name of petitioners No.2.

Out of the award amount, Rs.10,00,000/- is allotted to the petitioner No.4, Rs.10,00,000/- shall be released through E-payment directly to the account of the petitioner No.4 by obtaining her account details.

Draw an award accordingly.
