This petition is coming on 30.07.2026 before me for final hearing in the presence of **Sri S.Chaitanya**, Advocate for the Petitioner and the Respondent set exparte and the matter having stood over for consideration till this day and this Court made the following:

:: O R D E R ::

1. Petitioner filed this petition under Sec.13 (1) (ia) of H.M Act for grant of decree of divorce on the ground of cruelty and for costs of the petition.

2. **The brief averments of the petition are as follows:**

a) The respondent is the husband of petitioner. Their marriage was performed on 01.02.2023 at Saibaba Temple, Seethanagarm, Tadeipalli Mandal as per Hindu Dharma Sastras and customs. During their wedlock they have no children.

b) The petitioner is studying B.Tech final year in St. Mary's Womens Engineering College at Guntur. Their marriage is love marriage. The respondent cheated the petitioner in the name of love and married her at Saibaba Temple, Seethanagaram, Tadepalli, Guntur District without the consent and presence of her parents.

c) After their marriage the petitioner and the respondent went to Krishna Lanka, Vijayawada police station immediately for their protection. The same was intimated by the Krishna Lanka police, Vijayawada to the parents of the petitioner. Then the parents of the petitioner shocked at this news and rushed to police station, the police told about their marriage of their daughter with respondent. Thereafter the parents of the petitioner went to police station, Tadepalli and enquired about their marriage. In the mean time one of the relatives of the petitioner by name Praturi Anusha rushed to police station, Tadepalli and she openly had beaten the respondent and stated before the police that the respondent is her husband and showed some photos and videos of the respondent and her as evidence that the respondent is her husband. Then the petitioner came to know that the respondent cheated said Praturi Anusha also with dissembling hoaxical words and married her secretly after death of her husband. Further the petitioner came to know that the said Praturi Anusha and the respondent lived together gave birth to a female child. The petitioner and her parents and police also shocked at the swindling attitude of the respondent. Understanding the treacherous nature of the respondent the Tadepalli Police warned the respondent and told him to handover the photos of the petitioner to her parents. The respondent agreed for this. But the respondent did not give the photos to the parents of the petitioner immediately and persuaded the police so that give the photos at home as the photos were kept at home. Because of the attitude of the respondent, the petitioner has not interested

with the respondent, if she lives with the respondent the life of the petitioner will fall in danger. Hence, the petitioner decided to file petition for divorce such a cruel hatred person moreover he got married another woman. After this incident the petitioner went to her home with their parents leaving the respondent at the police station itself. From 02.02.2023 they both have been living separately and they did not live together any time in the life. In the meantime the respondent now and then loitering about the petitioner's house would threaten her to come and join with him otherwise he would claim her life without hesitation.

The respondent went to Disha Police station, Guntur and gave a complaint against petitioner and her parents. The said Disha police referred this matter to Thulluru P.S. The police authorities also gave counseling to the respondent not to force the petitioner to lead life with him. Thereafter the respondent has intentionally filed a petition as HMOP No.100/2023 on the file of Senior Civil Judge, Mangalagiri under Restitution of Conjugal rights against the petitioner. The petitioner also contested the same matter. Consequently the life of the petitioner became miserable and deplorable; as such the acts and activities of the respondent tend to destroy the legitimate objects and ends of matrimony. There is no other option to the petitioner except constrained to file this petition on the ground of cruelty. Hence, the petition.

3. Respondent called absent and No representation, Respondent was set *exparte* as per docket order dated 06.07.2026. During the course of enquiry, Petitioner was examined as PW1 and Exs.P1 to P4 were marked.

4. Heard learned counsel for the Petitioner.

5. Perused the record.

6. Now the point for consideration is :

Whether the Petitioner is entitled to seek divorce from the Respondent on the ground of cruelty as prayed for?

7. Petitioner was examined as P.W.1 by filing chief affidavit in lieu of her chief examination. PW1 deposed same as on the lines of petition averments. PW1 during her evidence deposed that her marriage was performed with the respondent on 01.02.2023 at Saibaba temple, Seethanagaram, Tadepalli Mandal, Guntur District according to Hindu rites and customs at the house of the respondent. They have no children. P.W.1 further submitted that she studied B.Tech at Guntur. The petitioner and the respondent loved each other and take photographs now and then. In the month of January, 2023 while the petitioner coming to home on leave from Guntur Hostel for holiday. The respondent showing those photographs threatened her to marry him, otherwise he would show the photos to the villagers. PW.1 further deposed that after marriage the respondent went to Police station, Vijayawada immediately for protection and the same was intimated by police to her parents, her parents rushed to the police station. The police told about her marriage with respondent, in the meantime one of her relative by name Praturi Anusha (widow) rushed to police station, Tadepalli and she openly had beaten the respondent and stated before the police that the respondent is her husband and showed some photos and videos of the respondent and her as evidence that the respondent is her husband. PW.1 further deposed that the respondent cheated her and married said Praturi Anusha (widow) secretly after death of her husband. She came to know that the said Praturi Anusha and the respondent lived together gave birth to a female child. PW.1 further deposed that the police warned the respondent and

told him to handover the photos of the petitioner to her parents, the respondent agreed for this, but the respondent did not give the photos to her parents immediately and persuaded the police that give the photos at home as the photos were kept at home. PW.1 further deposed that because of the attitude of the respondent, she have not interested with the respondent. After this incident she went to her home with her parents and from 02.02.2023 both living separately and they never did not live together any time in the life. PW.1 further deposed that the respondent now and then loitering about her house would threaten her to come and join with him otherwise, he would claim her life without hesitation. The respondent intentionally filed a petition as HMOP No.100/2023 on the file of Senior Civil Judge, Mangalagiri under the Restitution of conjugal rights against her, she contested the matter. The evidence of PW1 remained unchallenged. This evidence of PW.1 reflects cruelty of petitioner by respondent. The respondent did not adduce any evidence to disprove petitioner evidence. Thus, Petitioner by examining herself as P.W.1 and by exhibiting Ex.P1 to P4 established that petitioner and respondent are wife and husband and that respondent harassed her by and mentally. Hence, this court holds that the petitioner is entitled for decree of divorce on the ground of cruelty. Point is answered accordingly.

8. In the result, the petition is allowed without costs granting decree of divorce by dissolving the marriage of petitioner and the respondent dated 01.02.2023 U/s 13(1) (ia) of H.M.Act.
