This petition is coming on this day for hearing before me in the presence of Sri Ch. Sivarama Krishna, Advocate for petitioners and upon perusing the material on record and having stood over till this day for consideration, this Court made the following:-

ORDER

1. The petition is filed by the petitioners under section 13-B of Hindu Marriage Act, 1955 for dissolution of marriage between the petitioners by way of granting decree of divorce on mutual consent.

2. The brief facts of the Petition are that, the Petitioners are the Husband and Wife respectively and their marriage was performed on 18-02-2024 at Kasu Central Function Hall, Narasaraopet according to Hindu Caste Custom, Dharma Sastra. Immediately after the marriage, the 2nd Petitioner joined with the 1st Petitioner and they lived happily for one month. The marriage was consummated.

i) Unfortunately, some misunderstandings arose between the Petitioners. Subsequently, the 2nd Petitioner separated herself from the house of the 1st Petitioner on 20-03-2024 and since then they have been living separately. In spite of mediations by either side elders, there is no hope of reunion. Under the above circumstances, at the intervention of elders, both the petitioners decided to dissolve their marriage.

ii) As per the settlement of the elders, the 1st Petitioner paid an amount of Rs.4,00,000/- (Rupees four lakhs only) by cash and gold ornaments to 2nd Petitioner for permanent alimony. The 2nd Petitioner was agreed to receive the same accordingly. No similar petitioner was filed before any court and there is no collusion in between the Petitioners. Hence, the petition.

3. Now, the point for determination is --

Whether the petitioners are entitled for decree of divorce on mutual consent as prayed for ?

4. On behalf of the petitioners, P.Ws.1 and 2 were examined and Ex.P1 *Wedding Card*, Ex.P.2 Original Aadhar Card of the 1st Petitioner were marked through P.W.1. Ex.P.3 Original Aadhar Card of the 2nd Petitioner was marked through P.w.2.

5. Heard the counsel for the petitioners.

POINT:-

6. In order to substantiate their contention, the Petitioners themselves are examined as P.Ws.1 and 2 respectively and marked Ex.P1 *Wedding Card*, Ex.P.2

Original Aadhar Card of the 1st Petitioner and Ex.P.3/Original Aadhar Card of the 2nd Petitioner and proved the fact that their marriage took place on 18-02-2024 at Narasaraopet as per Hindu Cast and Customs and also proved their residence. It is an admitted fact that since 20-03-2024 Petitioners are living separately. The evidence of P.w.1 and P.w.2 corroborated with each other and proved that the marriage of the Petitioners was irretrievably broken and there is no chance for reunion and they settled the matter amicably. In view of the above circumstances, there is no possibility to continue the Petitioners in marital tie. Hence, the petitioners are entitled for decree of divorce on mutual consent. Accordingly, the point is answered.

7. In the result, the petition is allowed and the marriage of the Petitioners is dissolved by way of granting decree of divorce on mutual consent. No costs.
