ORDER BELOW EXH. 1

1. This bail application has been filed by applicant/accused no.1 **Rupesh Suresh Adbal** and accused no. 2 **Krushna Raju More** under Section **483** of the Bharatiya Nagarik Suraksha Sanhita (BNSS), 2023 for grant of bail, in connection with Crime No. **64/2026** for the offence punishable under Section 310 and 311 of the Bharatiya Nyaya Sanhita (BNS), 2023, registered with Baramati Taluka Police Station, Dist. Pune.

2. **The allegations in the FIR are summarized as under:**

On 07/02/2026 at about 8.00 pm informant alighted at Bhigwan and was intending to go to Shardanagar, Baramati. He was waiting for the bus, however no bus came. He boarded in a Tempo vehicle at Bhigwan, one more person Pankaj Dhaigude also boarded in said Tempo vehicle. They both were traveling through said tempo vehicle driven by Vishwajeet Shahaji Petkar. At about 8.50 pm their vehicle was reached at Jainakwadi Phata, at that time 6 to 7 persons were present on road, holding deadly weapons scythe, iron rod, wooden rods in their hands and they restrained the vehicle, however the driver has not stopped the tempo vehicle, on which one of the thief inflicted blow of rod on glass of tempo vehicle due to which glass was broken. The driver stopped the vehicle, on which other thieves under threat of scythe got alighted informant, driver of tempo and co-passenger. They robbed the belongings of informant, co-passenger and driver. They also

assaulted informant, co-passenger and driver by deadly weapon scythe and caused grievous injuries. They robbed mobile phone, power bank, money and documents and other belongings of informant, co-passenger and driver. Thereafter they fled away towards Bhigwan side on two-wheeler scooty and in rickshaw vehicle. Thereafter, the informant with the help of other peoples came to Government Medical College and Hospital, Baramati and then lodged complaint. The informant given description of stolen property and also description of accused in the first information report. On the basis of said report, above referred crime has been registered.

3. Accused have been arrested on 08/02/2026, they were remanded to police custody remand till 11/02/2026. Since 11/02/2026 they are remanded in Judicial Custody remand. Hence, they filed this bail application on the grounds raised in their application.

4. The prosecution has strongly resisted the application by filing its reply at **Exh.5**. Contents in it are nothing but replica of contents of FIR. Lastly, urged for rejecting the application.

5. The applicant no.1/accused Rupesh Suresh Adbal not pressed his bail application by filing pursis Exh.8. Hence, his application is disposed of as not pressed.

6. Heard arguments of both sides. Learned counsel for the applicant/accused submitted that, since 08/02/2026 the applicant/accused Krushna Raju More is in custody. Period of more than 1 month is completed since the date of his arrest. Nothing

remained to be recovered or discovered. This applicant/accused seeking bail on medical grounds, as he suffering from incurable disease of HIV. He further submitted that, the applicant/accused placed on record the copy of medical report under list Exh. 7, he require regular medication. Lastly, urged for granting bail.

7. The learned A.P.P. submitted that, offence is serious one. The test identification parade of arrested accused is required to be conducted. There is possibility of tampering evidence. There is possibility of threatening informant and prosecution witnesses. There is possibility of repetition of crime. Other accused are still absconding. Mobile phone robbed by accused are yet to be recovered. Hence, urged for rejecting application.

8. The investigation officer was called before the court, he was asked about progress of the investigation, however no satisfactory answers given by him. He has not explained why till date TIP has not been conducted, though period of 1 month is lapsed from the date of arrest of applicant/accused Krushna Raju More.

9. On hearing submissions of both sides, I have evaluated the recitals of FIR, statements of witnesses, copies of documents. At this stage, it reveals from the material placed on record that, there is complicity of this accused in the crime registered against him. However, the applicant/accused is seeking bail on medical grounds. He has filed on record the copy of medical report under list Exh.7. It shows that, he is HIV positive patient. The submissions of learned counsel for the applicant/accused shows that, the applicant/accused requires and needs proper medical treatment.

He is ready to obey the conditions. He has no criminal antecedents. Hence, considering these contentions and the medical grounds, supported by copy of medical report, this court is of the view that, applicant/accused Krushna Raju More is required to be released on bail by imposing conditions on him purely on his medical grounds. Hence, I pass following order.

ORDER

1. The Bail Application No. 128/2026 of applicant/accused no. 1 Rupesh Suresh Adbal is disposed of as not pressed.
2. The Bail Application No. 128/2026 of applicant/accused no.2 Krushna Raju More is allowed.
3. Applicant/accused **no. 2 Krushna Raju More** be released on bail in C.R. No. **64/2026** for the offence punishable under Section 310, 311 of the Bharatiya Nyaya Sanhita (BNS), 2023, registered with Baramati Taluka Police Station, Dist. Pune on execution of P.R. of **Rs.50,000/- (Rupees Fifty Thousand)** and on furnishing surety in like amount on following conditions :
 - [i] The applicant/accused shall attend the Baramati Taluka Police Station once in a week on every Sunday in between **11.00 A.M. to 2.00 P.M.** till filing of charge-sheet/final report.
 - [ii] The applicant/accused shall co-operate the investigation officer in the investigation of this case and remain present before him as and when called.
 - [iii] The applicant/accused shall not temper with prosecution evidence or pressurize the informant and prosecution witnesses in any manner whatsoever.
 - [iv] The applicant/accused shall give declaration of place of his residence and shall file the proof of residence, both present and permanent on record.
 - [v] The applicant/accused shall not leave the

jurisdiction of this Court without prior permission.

- [vi] The applicant/accused shall not directly or indirectly make any inducement, threat or promise to any person including informant and prosecution witnesses acquainted with the facts of the case so as to dissuade them from disclosing such facts to the Court or any police officer.
- [vii] The applicant/accused shall not indulge in any criminal activities.
- [viii] The applicant/accused shall comply with Chapter-I, Paragraphs 1 to 6 of the Criminal Manual, 1980. (In view of order of the Hon'ble Bombay High Court passed in Criminal Application No.28 of 2010 in Public Interest Litigation No. 25 of 2010 on January 29, 2020).

4. If breach of the any of the above conditions committed, then investigating officer is as liberty to move application for cancellation of bail.
5. Bail before Ld. J.M.F.C.
6. Interlocutory applications pending if any, stands disposed of.
7. The bail application is accordingly disposed of.
8. Intimate to the concerned police station accordingly.
9. The soft copy of this order be sent to the accused by E-mail through Jail Superintendent as per the direction of the Hon'ble Supreme Court of India, in the case of in Re-policy Strategy for grant of bail in SMWP (Cri.No. 04/2021, dated 21/03/2024).
