ORDER BELOW EXH. 1

1. This bail application has been filed by applicant/accused **no.2 Mohammad Anis Mohammad Yunus and accused no. 3 Aizaz Bhangu Mirawale** under Section **483** of the Bharatiya Nagarik Suraksha Sanhita (BNSS), 2023 for grant of bail, in connection with Crime No. **52/2026** for the offence punishable under Section 303(2), 310(1), 3(5) of the Bharatiya Nyaya Sanhita (BNS), 2023, registered with Baramati Taluka Police Station, Dist. Pune.

3. **The allegations in the FIR are summarized as under:**

On 29/01/2026 at about 10.30 am, informant Ramesh Wable has gone on ground of Vidya Pratishthan at Baramati for attending funeral of late Dy. Chief Minister Ajitdada Pawar. There

was crowd of people. At about 12.30 pm when he was present in front of the stage, he feel some uneasiness to his neck regarding stretching his neck, therefore he turned back and noticed that one person was snatching gold chain from his neck, he caught hold the said thief at the spot itself, however he handed over gold chain to another person and the said person fled away by taking disadvantage of crowd of people. He came to know that, on that day gold chain of Nilesh Laxman Kate was also snatched but the peoples caught those thieves red hand. He also came to know that, gold Ghantan of Sau. Vijaya Gajanan Pawar, gold chain of Ashok Narayan More, gold chain of Manohar Vitthal Jadhav, gold chain of Vijay @ Balasaheb Yashwant Shinde, gold chain of Jalindhar Kundlik Basle, gold chain of Sanjay Bhalchandra Kate were snatched by the thieves. The thieves were caught hold red handed by the informant and other persons and they were brought to Baramati Taluka Police Station, thereat accused told their names. On report lodged by informant above referred FIR has been registered against the accused.

4. The applicants/accused no.2 and 3 have been arrested on 29/01/2026, they were remanded to police custody remand till 06/02/2026. Since 06/02/2026 they are remanded in Judicial Custody remand. Hence, they filed this bail application on the grounds raised in their application.

5. The prosecution has strongly resisted the application by filing its reply at **Exh.5**. Contents in it are nothing but replica of contents of FIR. Lastly, urged for rejecting the application.

6. Heard arguments of both sides. Learned counsel for the applicants/accused submitted that, these accused have been arrested on suspicion. No role attributed to them. Offence under Section 310(1) of B.N.S. added without reasonable ground. These applicants/accused have no criminal antecedents. Since last more than one and half month they are in custody. No personal interrogation is required, as already they were remanded to police custody and investigation officer interrogated them. Nothing seized from their possession. They are ready to co-operate in the investigation. They are ready to obey the conditions. Hence, urged for granting bail.

7. The learned A.P.P. submitted that, offence is serious one. These accused and their associates snatched gold ornaments and gold chain of the people in crowd gathered for funeral of late Dy.C.M. Ajitdada Pawar. They had stolen gold worth Rs.48,50,000/-. Investigation is in progress. The vehicles are to be seized. Stolen articles are also required to be seized. There is possibility of destroying evidence, causing interference in the investigation. There is sufficient material on record regarding complicity of accused in serious offence. Hence, urged for rejecting application.

8. On hearing submissions of both sides I have evaluated the recitals of FIR, statements of witnesses, copies of documents. At this stage, it reveals from the material placed on record that, there is complicity of these accused in the crime registered against them. The investigation is in progress. The stolen gold ornaments are yet to be recovered. If, at this stage the applicants/accused are

released, there is every possibility of destroying evidence, tampering evidence, causing interference in the investigation. Hence, considering nature and gravity of the offence, this court is of the view that, the applicants/accused are not entitled for bail. In the result, I pass following order.

ORDER

1. The Bail Application **No.160/2026 (Exh.1)** of **accused No. no.2 Mohammad Anis Mohammad Yunus and accused no. 3 Aizaz Bhangu Mirawale**, in connection with Crime No. **52/2026 for the offence punishable under Section 303(2), 310(1), 3(5)** of the Bharatiya Nyaya Sanhita (BNS), 2023, registered with Baramati Taluka Police Station, Dist. Pune, **is rejected.**
2. Interlocutory applications pending if any, stands disposed of.
3. The bail application (Exh.1) is accordingly disposed of.
4. Intimate to the concerned police station accordingly.
