

IN THE NATIONAL LOK-ADALAT,
HELD ON 14/03/2026 AT BARAMATI, DIST. PUNE

AWARD

1. The petitioners No. 1 to 5 with their advocate and representative of Opponent No.2– Cholamandalam MS General Insurance Company Ltd.. along with its advocate are today present before the panel of this Lok-adalat and they have amicably settled their dispute in terms of compromise memo below **Exh.13** and Form-I on record below **Exh.12**. Both the parties admitted the contents therein to be true and correct and also admitted their signatures. Advocates of both parties attested signatures of the respective parties. The applicant no. 2 to 4 filed their affidavits at Exh.15, 16, 18 and 20 contending therein that, entire compensation amount may be paid to the applicant no.1, who is their natural mother. Hence, in terms of compromise memo **Exh.13 and affidavits Exh. 15, 16, 18 and 20**, following order is passed.

ORDER

1. Opponent No.2– Cholamandalam MS General Insurance Company Ltd. shall pay the entire amount of compensation of **Rs.8,20,000/- (Rupees Eight Lakh and Twenty Thousand only)** to the petitioner No.1 including the amount of No Fault liability, within the period of **60** days from the date of this order.
2. The Opponent No.2– Cholamandalam MS General Insurance Company Ltd. shall deposit total compensation of **Rs.8,20,000/- (Rupees Eight Lakh and Twenty Thousand only)** in the saving bank account of Member, Motor Accident Claims Tribunal, Baramati i.e. Account No.4105490051-5, Type of Account – CA-DBT-GOVT AGENCY A/C-INR, IFSC Code -SBIN0000321 of State Bank of India, Branch- Bhigwan Road, Baramati, Dist. Pune by NEFT / RTGS Only towards

and full and final settlement.

3. On depositing the amount of compensation as directed by this Tribunal, an amount of **Rs.2,00,000/-** be invested in fixed deposits for the period of 3 years in the name of petitioner no.1 and remaining amount of Rs.6,20,000/- be paid to her by depositing the same in her bank account by RTGS or NEFT after due identification and verification as per Rules.
4. In view of compromise memo available on record below **Exh.13 and affidavits Exh.15, 16, 18 and 20**, the petition is stand disposed of as settled.
5. Deficit court fees, if any, be recovered from the petitioner no. 1.
6. Court Fees, be refunded to the petitioner no.1 as per rules.
7. Claim petition against remaining respondents stands dismissed.
8. Claim petition is disposed of accordingly.
