This is an application filed by accused No.2 **Nikhil Mohan Khaladkar** for seeking no objection from this Court to the passport authority to issue passport.

2. Perused the application, it appears from record that, the accused is charged for the offence punishable under **Sections 324, 323, 504 and 506** read with **Section 34** of the Indian Penal Code. The present applicant is permanent resident within the jurisdiction of this Court. He has submitted that, he is ready to abide with all terms and conditions which will be imposed by this Court. As he wants to go to abroad for getting information about new advance technology regarding agriculture, hence, prayed to allow the present application by issuing no objection to the passport authority for issuing passport to him.

3. Learned APP filed his say overleaf of this application. He submitted that if the present application is allowed, accused may flee away from the jurisdiction of the Court. Hence, prayed to reject the application.

4. Read the application and say. Heard. On perusal of record it shows that, the case is pending for hearing. Applicant

sought permission to go abroad. The applicant has stated on an affidavit that, he is resident and his immovable property situated within the jurisdiction of this Court. Hence, there is no chance of his absconding, if he permitted to go abroad. Thus, I am of the opinion that, it would not be proper to reject the application for pendency of case against him. There is no possibility of his absconding or settling in foreign country. Considering the prayer for permission to go abroad, it can not be said that the matter would unnecessarily prolong. I, therefore see no reason to refuse permission to applicant/accused to go abroad. Hence, the order-

ORDER

1. Application is allowed.
2. Permission is granted for issuing the passport to the applicant/accused **No.2 Nikhil Mohan Khaladkar** resident of Jategaon Budruk, Tq. Shirur, Dist. Pune.
3. The Regional Passport Officer is at liberty to grant passport to the applicant/accused **No.2 Nikhil Mohan Khaladkar** as per rules, the Court has no objection to grant passport to him.
4. Before leaving India, he is directed to furnish his postal address where he intent to stay.
5. Upon Securing the passport a notarized

copy of the passport shall be furnished to this Court within a period of 30 days from its issuance.

6. In the event applicant to travel outside India, he shall file a written application (with his detailed travel program, address abroad and contact members), before the Court and secure necessary orders prior to his departure.
7. After returning back, he shall intimate this Court.
