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**Petition for Divorce U/s. 13B of the
Hindu Marriage Act, 1955.**

1) The petitioner no.1 and 2 have filed present petition for divorce by mutual consent under section 13-B of the Hindu Marriage

Act, 1955.

2) The petitioners state that, their registered marriage was solemnized as per Hindu Vedic rites, rituals, ceremonies on **05-03-2002** at Pune. Out of the said wedlock they have two daughters namely Pallavi & Saloni.

3) The petitioners further state that, after marriage when they started residing together irreconcilable disputes and differences arose between them on account of temperamental differences. Therefore, since January 2021 they have separated from each other. They assured that inspite of attempts made for their reconciliation, it is impossible for them to live together. In these circumstances the petitioners have decided to break-up the relationship as husband and wife by way of decree of divorce by mutual consent and hence filed present petition.

4) Petitioner no.1 and 2 have filed on record their evidence on affidavits vide **Exh.13** and **Exh.14**. They have submitted documentary evidence i.e. copy of their Marriage certificate at **Exh.15**. They also filed verified copies of Aadhar Cards of both the petitioners at **Exh.16** & **Exh.17**. They also filed evidence close pursis at **Exh.18**.

5) From the foregoing evidence it transpired that, the petitioners are residing separately since more than one year prior to filing present petition. Therefore, it is proved that, reunion is not possible between them. Present petition is filed on 05-01-2023. The cooling period of six months is completed. After marriage both the

petitioners were resided within the jurisdiction of this Court at Panvel & Kharghar, therefore, it appears that present petition comes within the jurisdiction of this Court.

6) Both the petitioners have decided to break-up the relationship as husband and wife by their free consent. This court has verified that there is no force or coercion on both the parties. All the disputes between the parties have been resolved.

7) The petitioners are firm for taking mutual divorce and praying for mutual divorce. From the above overall discussions and affidavits of evidence, the petitioners are entitled for decree of divorce by way of mutual consent. Accordingly, I proceed to pass the following order.

:: ORDER ::

1.	Petition is allowed.
2.	The marriage solemnized between the petitioner No.1 and 2 on 05-03-2002 is hereby dissolved from the date of the order, under section 13-B of the Hindu Marriage Act, 1955.
3.	Copy of Judgment be given to the petitioners free of cost as per section 23(4) of the Hindu Marriage Act, 1955.
4.	Decree be drawn up accordingly.
