Prosecution has no serious objection for allowing the accused to visit abroad. He was earlier also permitted and nothing has come on record that he violated any term or condition of the previous order. Hence, application is allowed and accused is permitted to visit Bahrain, Dammam and Qatar from 23.11.2024 to 30.11.2024 on the same terms and conditions which were imposed in the order dated 16.10.2024. FDR of the accused is still lying with the court.

Let the passport of the accused lying deposited with the court be returned to him or his counsel which shall be redeposited in the court within three days of return from journey. The LOC opened against the accused is suspended temporarily for the period from 23.11.2024 to 30.11.2024. Intimation in this regard be sent to Immigration Office through email as well as to

the IO who will coordinate with the Immigration Office informing it about the temporary suspension of the LOC. Counsel stated that the LOC opened be withdrawn permanently. Let he to move proper application in this regard which will be considered as per law. Application is now finally disposed off. Copy of the order be given dasti to the counsel for accused and this misc. application file be consigned to record room.
