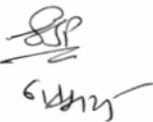

ORDER BELOW BAIL APPLICATION OF ACCUSED
NO.3 RAJENDRA NARAYAN SAPRE

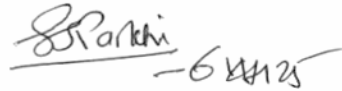
1. The accused have made present application for bail.
2. The applicant sought bail on the ground that, the applicant is innocent and falsely implicated in this crime. Investigation is completed and charge-sheet is filed. He is ready to co-operate in the further investigation and ready to abide by any conditions imposed by the court.
3. Say of Ld. APP was called. He resisted the application by filing his say. Ld. APP has submitted that there is prima-facie involvement of the present accused in the present case. Accused played key role in the present offence. There are specific allegations against the accused No.3. In the investigation role of the accused transpired and accused No.3 is also beneficiary of the cheated amount from various persons. Accused No.3 is the person who made false signature on the forged and false appointment letters and involved similar as prime accused. Hence, he has prayed for rejection of the application.
4. Perused and read application with say of Ld. APP. Heard Ld. Advocate for the accused and Ld. APP. They argued as per their stands.
5. In this matter, charge-sheet is filed. Prima-facie investigation is completed. As per the principles recorded by the Hon'ble Supreme Court in



Satyendrakumar Antil Vs. CBI (2022) 10 SCC 51; the accused shall not be kept behind bars if they are not arrested after filing of charge-sheet. Therefore, there is no reason to keep accused behind the bars. Liberty of a person is the constitutional right. Bail is a rule and jail is an exception. Co-accused are already released on bail. On the ground of parity, this accused is also entitled for bail. Therefore, it is just and proper to release said accused on bail. Hence, following order :-

ORDER

- i) The application is allowed.
- ii) The accused be released on bail on his executing PB & SB of Rs.50,000/- or PB of Rs. 50,000/- and cash bail of Rs. 35,000/-, as prayed.
