:: ORDER BELOW EXH. 14 ::
(Passed on 12th October, 2022)

1. The present application is filed by the applicant for releasing him on regular bail.

2. The applicant contended that he was absent on the dates of hearing. Therefore NBW was issued against him. He has been arrested in execution of NBW on 07/09/2022 and since then he is behind bar. He further contended that he is aged person and was not feeling well. Therefore he could not attend the dates of hearing. He intentionally had not remain absent on the dates of hearing. The charges is framed against him and nothing is to be recovered or discovered at his instance. He prayed that he may be released on regular bail.

3. The learned A.P.P. filed his say at Exh.15. He contended that the offence is serious in nature. The applicant has misused his liberty. The trial is delay due to absence of applicant. He further contended that if the applicant is released on regular bail, there are chances that he may again

abscond and delay the trial. He prayed that the application be rejected.

4. Heard learned advocates appearing for parties.

5. On perusal of material available on record it appears that applicant is arrested on 07/09/2022 in execution of non bailable warrant. The non bailable warrant was issued against applicant as he was not attending the dates of hearing. The reason stated by the applicant for his non appearance is that he was not feeling well. The accused was earlier released on regular bail. Therefore taking into consideration the reason stated by the applicant for his absence in my opinion the applicant can be released on regular bail by putting stringent conditions for his appearance of trial. Hence, I proceed to pass following order.

ORDER

1. The application is allowed.
2. The applicant/accused **Shri.Arjun Janu Kheratkar** be released on bail in **Crime No.132/2021** registered at Goregaon Police Station, for the offence punishable u/s. 354A, 354D, 177 r/w.34 of Indian Penal Code, on his executing PB of Rs.25,000/- (Rupees Twenty Five Thousand Only) with one solvent surety in like amount.

3. The applicant shall visit concern Police Station once in the month i.e. on every 2nd Saturday of month (between 10.00 a.m. to 2.00 p.m.) till conclusion of trial.
4. The applicant shall not tamper with the evidence of prosecution or pressurize the witnesses.
5. The applicant shall furnish his residential proof to the Investigation Officer as well as file the same in Court.
6. Violation of any condition will entail for cancellation of bail.
7. The applicant shall attend each and every date of hearing.
8. Bail be furnish before concern Court.
