Present: Applicant/Accused Ravindra Biyani, (A-78) (through VC) along with Ms. Ragini Juneja, Advocate (through VC).
Sh. Anupam S. Sharrma, Spl. PP for CBI (through VC) assisted by Sh. Abhiyant Singh, who has appeared physically in the court.

This is an application filed on behalf of applicant/accused No. 78, Ravindra Biyani, seeking release of security in the form of an FDR.

Reply to the application has been filed by the CBI.

Ld. Counsel for the applicant submits that vide order dated 26.02.2026, the applicant was granted permission to travel to Dubai from 05.03.2026 to 14.03.2026 and thereafter to Thailand from 14.03.2026 to 20.03.2026, subject to certain conditions, one of which required furnishing of security of Rs. 15 lakhs in the form of an FDR before the Court, which was to be returned to the applicant/accused upon his return, subject to there being no violation of the terms and conditions. It is further submitted that the said FDR was duly deposited by the applicant before the Court.

Ld. Counsel further submits that due to unavoidable circumstances, the applicant could not undertake the aforesaid

travel despite the permission granted by this Court and, therefore, the security deposited in the form of FDR amounting to Rs. 15 lakhs be released in his favour.

Heard. In view of the submissions made, the security of Rs. 15 lakhs in the form of an FDR deposited by the applicant/accused No. 78, Ravindra Biyani along with his application to travel abroad, be released to him as per rules.

The application stands disposed of accordingly.
