ORDER BELOW EXHIBIT 1 IN BAIL APPLICATION NO.449/2026
(Dated 10/06/2026)

The applicant Nityanand Hariprakash Shahi has filed present application for regular bail under section 483 of BNSS, 2023 in C.R.No.179/2026 registered with Taloja Police Station for the offences p/u/secs.223, 274, 275, 123 of Bhartiya Nyay Sanhita, 2023 and section 26(1), 26(2)(i), 26(2)(iv), 27(3)(d), 27(3)(e), 30(2)(a) and 59 of the Food Safety and Standards Act, 2006.

2. In short the prosecution case is that on 04/05/2026 the informant Police constable Rajesh Gajanan Ugade was received secret information that prohibited material Pan Masala and scented Tobacco was stored at Prakash Patil chawl, room No.3, Nawade village. When he alongwith other police personals raided the said place, applicant/accused was found in possession of prohibited food articles like Vimal pan masala, scented tobacco worth Rs.82,560/-. The informant and his associates seized the entire prohibited articles and thereafter informant lodged detailed report which Taloja Police Station. On the basis

of report so lodged by informant, an offence came to be registered vide C.R.No.179/2026 under above mentioned sections.

3. Heard Ld. Adv. Shri Akash Dongre for the applicant and Ld. APP Shri Y. S. Bhopi for the opponent State. Perused application and say filed by opponent State at Exh.5.

4. Ldv. Adv.Shri Dongre vehemently argued that, the applicant is innocent. He has nothing to do with the crime in question. The applicant is not a manufacturer of alleged prohibited food articles. There is no report of chemical analyzer to show that seized muddemal is containing any poisonous substance. Shri Dongre, further argued that, the investigating agency has already seized the entire muddemal articles. The investigation is practically completed. Since 04/05/2026 the applicant is behind bars. In such circumstances, his further detention in jail is not required. The applicant is ready to abide by the terms and conditions which may be imposed by the court. Hence, Shri Dongre prayed that the applicant be released on bail.

5. Per contra, Ld.APP Shri Bhopi submitted that, the offence is serious and antisocial. Huge stock of prohibited articles has been seized at the instance of applicant. The investigation is in progress. Considering aforesaid circumstances and role attributed to applicant, if he is released on bail, definitely he will

indulge again in similar kind of offence. Hence, it is prayed by Shri. Bhopi that, the application be rejected.

6. After giving thoughtful consideration to the submissions advanced by both Ld. Advocates, I have gone through the material placed on record. On appraisal of papers it appears that the applicant was found in possession of prohibited food articles. Admittedly police have seized entire prohibited food articles at the instance of applicant. It is pertinent to note that applicant is not manufacturer of seized food articles. Likewise, he did not administer any poisonous or stupefying substance to anyone. The applicant is languishing in the jail since 04/05/2026. Substantial part of the investigation must have completed. Considering aforesaid aspects and role attributed to applicant, in my view his further detention in jail is not warranted. So far as the apprehension raised by learned APP is concerned, it can be taken care by imposing certain conditions upon the applicant. Resultantly, I pass the following order.

ORDER

1. The application is allowed.
2. The applicant Nityanand Hariprakash Shahi shall be released on bail in C.R.No.179/2026 registered with Talaja Police Station for the offences p/u/secs.223, 274, 275, 123 of Bhartiya Nyay Sanhita, 2023 and section 26(1), 26(2)(i), 26(2)(iv), 27(3)(d), 27(3)(e), 30(2) (a) and 59 of the Food Safety and Standards Act, 2006.

3. The applicant shall attend the Taloja Police Station on every Thursday between 12.00 noon and 3.00 pm till the filing of charge-sheet.
4. Applicant shall not directly or indirectly make any inducement, threat and promise to any person acquainted with the facts of the case so as to dissuade him from disclosing such facts to the Court or nay police officer.
5. Bail before Ld. Lower Court.
6. Copy of order be sent to jail authority by E-mail.
