ORDER BELOW EXH.1 IN CRIMINAL BAIL APPLICATION

NO. 31 OF 2026

[Sudarshan Subhash Mohite Vs. State of Maharashtra]

1. Accused Sudarshan Subhash Mohite has filed this application for bail in connection with C.R. No. 88/2026 registered with Islampur police station for the offences punishable under Section 108 of Bharatiya Nyaya Sanhita, 2023 ('B.N.S.') .

2. The investigating officer and the original informant filed say and strongly resisted the application contending that the offence is serious of nature and investigation is going on.

3. The Advocate for the applicant submitted that the accused is arrested on 05.03.2026. Since then he is in jail. Police has seized the mobile phone and he is now remanded to Magistrate Custody. For further investigation, his custodial interrogation is not necessary. The applicant will abide by the

terms and conditions. Hence, prayed to grant the bail.

4. The learned APP and Advocate for the original informant opposed the application on the ground that investigation is in progress. If the accused is released on bail, he will pressurize the prosecution witnesses and will tamper the evidence. Hence, prayed to reject the application.

5. The FIR is lodged by Sharad Rangrao Kadam. As per contents of the FIR, the deceased was daughter of Sharad Kadam. On 24.02.2026 at about 10.00 a.m. he and his wife Gauri had been to Anuradha Hospital, Sangli for treatment of his mother. At about 3.00 p.m. his father made phone call to his wife and informed that daughter Sakshi committed suicide by hanging herself. On 04.03.2026 cousin sister (मावस बहिण) of deceased namely Snehal Ajit Suryawanshi had come to their house. She informed that deceased Sakshi and accused were having love affairs and after completing 18 years to deceased, they were going to marry in the Court. However, the accused was not ready for marriage and therefore, deceased Sakshi was in depression and she committed suicide. It is alleged that the accused abated the deceased to commit suicide. Accordingly, the crime was registered in Islampur police station, Sangli.

6. The alleged incident is occurred on 24.02.2026 and FIR is registered on 04.03.2026. The information of the informant that the accused denied to marry with deceased is hearsay. The witness Snehal who is relative of the informant. Her statement also recorded on 04.03.2026. As per her statement, on 24.02.2026 she met the deceased in the morning and at that time she was nervous. Though the said witness is relative of the deceased, she has not disclosed the said fact on the day of incident i.e. 24.02.2026 or immediately thereafter. Whether the deceased committed suicide due to refusal by the accused to marry or not, is matter of further investigation and trial. Considering the investigating officer has seized necessary documents and recorded statement of witnesses, there is no criminal antecedents against the accused, further detention of the accused is not necessary. Therefore, he can be released on bail by imposing certain conditions. Hence, the order.

ORDER

- (1). The bail application is allowed.
- (2). The applicant/accused shall be released on bail, on furnishing PR and SB of 25,000/- (Rupees Twenty Five Thousand only) with one solvent surety in like amount in connection with C.R. No. 88/2026 registered with Islampur police station for the offences punishable under Section 108 of Bharatiya Nyaya Sanhita, 2023

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- (i). The applicant shall not threaten, influence or tamper with the prosecution witnesses and evidence.
 - (ii). The applicant shall attend the concerned police station as and when called by the investigating officer.
 - (iii). The applicant shall furnish his address proof and mobile numbers and addresses of their two nearest relatives.
 - (iv). The applicant shall not commit any offence.
 - (v). Breach of aforesaid condition can be treated as jumping the bail condition and in such event the bail granted can be cancelled.
- (3). Inform the Jail Authority accordingly.
