

COMMON ORDERS BELOW EXHS. 79 TO 82 IN SPL.C.S.

The plaintiff has filed various applications to extend status quo order. It is submitted that, suit is filed for partition and possession, but plaintiff having apprehension about obstruction in his possession at the hands of defendants, thus, prayed for status quo. Accordingly it was granted. However, no order to extension of status quo was passed. Therefore further status quo order cannot be extended. Already the earlier application were rejected. Thus, subsequent applications for extension of status quo orders were pending for Say and further orders. The sum and substance, now after lapse of considerable period, it would not be appropriate to assume status of the suit property at this juncture for want of sufficient material on record. Therefore, considering the above facts and circumstances I come to the conclusion that all these applications needs to be rejected. Accordingly following order is passed.

ORDER

- (1) Applications Exhs.79 to 82 stands rejected.
- (2) Suit is pending for temporary injunction for considerable period. Therefore, on next date if plaintiff fails to argue on Exh. 6 will be taken into consideration at finality of suit.
