ORDER BELOW EXH.5

Perused the application filed by the plaintiff under Order XXXIX Rules 1, 2 of the Code of Civil Procedure, praying for ad-interim ex parte injunction till the decision of the temporary injunction application.

2. It is settled that ex-parte ad-interim injunction can be granted only in exceptional and urgent circumstances where delay would defeat the ends of justice. In the present case, the plaintiff has not demonstrated any such exceptional urgency or irreparable harm that would justify grant of an injunction without hearing the other side. The defendants residing at Gundewadi, Tal.Miraj, Dist.Sangli. Before passing any restraining order, it is just and necessary to afford an opportunity of hearing to the defendants, particularly to avoid multiplicity of litigation. Hence, I proceed to pass the following order:

ORDER

1	The prayer for ex-parte ad-interim injunction is hereby refused.
2	Issue show-cause notice to Defendants as to why ad-interim injunction should not be granted in favour of the plaintiff, returnable on: 23.12.2025.
3	Emergency process and special bailiff is allowed.
