

ORDER BELOW EXH.5 IN R.C.S. NO.555/2021

1. Heard Ld. Advocate for plaintiff regarding issuance of ex-parte ad-interim injunction.
2. Ld. Advocate for plaintiff submitted that, suit properties belongs to the plaintiff. Plaintiff purchased the said property from one Parmeshwar Prabhakar Tupsoundare. The suit is filed for perpetual injunction. Plaintiff is apprehending danger of obstruction by the defendant in his property. Cause of action as per plaintiff is dated 10/10/2021 when defendant entered into the suit property and obstructed the plaintiff in taking out the soyabean crops. Hence, plaintiff is praying for ad-interim ex-parte injunction.
3. Perused the documents. Plaintiff has submitted that, defendant is obstructing in suit property. On perusal of the case of the plaintiff, it is seen that, at this stage if ad-interim injunction is not granted, plaintiff will be at loss. No prejudice would be caused to the defendant if ad-interim ex-parte injunction is granted till the appearance and filing of say by defendant. Hence, the order.

ORDER

1. Ad-interim relief is granted.
2. Defendant is directed not to obstruct the plaintiff in the suit property till further order.
3. Issue notice to the defendant as to why ad-interim injunction shall not be granted. R/o.27/10/2021.
4. Plaintiff to comply O 39 R 3(a) of the Code of Civil Procedure.
