This order of mine shall dispose of the bail application moved on behalf of the applicant-accused Sanjiv Kumar.

Police record seen. In the present application, it is pleaded that the the applicant is an innocent person and has been falsely implicated by the police in the abovesaid FIR. The alleged recovery has already been effected and the accuse is in judicial custody, as such he is not required for any further investigation Lastly, it has been prayed that he may be granted bail pending trial.

Notice of this application was issued to the Ld.APP for the State for today who did not file reply to the same but opposed the orally.

I have heard the rival submissions of Ld.APP for the State and Ld.defence counsel and have gone through the material on record. From the perusal of the record, it reflects that the applicant-accused in this case has been charged U/S 454, 380 IPC and Section 454 IPC is punishable upto 10 years. Moreover, stolen property has also been received from the accused. As per the statement of HC Balwinder Singh, Section 411 IPC is added in this case. Therefore, in view of above facts and circumstances, I do not deem it appropriate to grant him concession of bail in this case. Hence, the present bail application in hands stands declined. Application stands disposed of accordingly.
