Criminal Bail Application No. 205/2026

ORDER BELOW EXHIBIT 1

(Shreyas Ashok Yadav Vs. State of Maharashtra)

1. This is an application filed by applicant Shreyas Ashok Yadav, under Section 483 of Bharatiya Nagrik Suraksha Sanhita 2023, in connection with C.R. no. 370/2026 registered with Satara City Police Station for the offence punishable under Sections 64 (2)(m), 65(1) of the Bharatiya Nyaya Sanhita, 2023 and under Sections 4, 6 of The Protection of Children From Sexual Offences Act, 2012 (Hereinafter the Bharatiya Nagrik Suraksha Sanhita 2023 referred to as 'BNSS', the Bharatiya Nyaya Sanhita, 2023 referred to as 'BNS' and The Protection of Children From Sexual Offences Act, 2012 referred to as 'POCSO' Act.)
2. The informant/victim has filed say vide Exh.05 and she has strongly opposed this application. The prosecution has also filed say at Exh.08 and resisted this bail application.
3. Heard Ld. advocate for the applicant and Spl. PP for the State. Perused an application, say filed by the prosecution and police papers.

4. The applicant has filed on record an application moved by the mother of the accused to Supdt. of Police Satara.

5. The victim is 15 yrs old and studying in 10th std in Lokmanya Vidyamandir Satara. The informant and her husband are working at MIDC. The FIR indicates that, on 20.04.2026, the mother and father of the victim observed that the victim was vomiting and therefore they took her to Shri Ganesh clinic, Amarlaxmi Degaon road, Satara. After examination and test conducted by the doctor, it was informed that the victim was pregnant. Thereafter, they took her for treatment to Civil hospital Satara. They took the victim in confidence and she disclosed that, she developed love relationship with the applicant since 3 yrs and they used to meet from time to time at Ajinkyatara Fort area and Lokmanya Vidyamandir area. On 06.03.2026, the applicant took her to roam at Ajinkyatara on his motorcycle and at that time the applicant repeatedly established forcible physical relations with her. Thereafter she started stomach-ache problem and vomiting.

6. Further, FIR indicates that, doctor informed to the informant/the mother of the victim that the victim was 10 months pregnant. After further inquiry with the victim, it was revealed that, earlier to 06.03.2026 also, the victim and applicant had established forceful physical relations repeatedly. Therefore, on 21.04.2026, the mother of the victim has lodged a report to the police against the applicant accordingly.

7. On perusal of the police papers it reveals that, the victim is 15 yrs 11 months old and her date of birth is 20.05.2010. It discloses from her statement that initially the victim was refusing to meet the applicant and after that upon insistence by the applicant, the victim started to meet the applicant and used to roam with the applicant on his motorcycle. Further it appears that, the victim has specifically stated that on 06.03.2026 and even earlier to that the applicant has established forceful sexual intercourse with her repeatedly and she became pregnant. She has also stated before the Magistrate u/s. 183 of B.N.S.S. 2023 regarding her acquaintance with the applicant and establishing physical relations by the applicant with her for 2 - 3 times. She has stated regarding her pregnancy also. Bonafide certificate of the victim discloses her date of birth as 20.05.2010.

8. The Medico Legal report of the sexual violence of the victim discloses the history narrated to the doctor and it shows that when she was in 8th std. (the victim was at that time only 13 yrs old), the applicant proposed her and they used to meet at Ajinkyatara Fort. They had penetrative sexual intercourse repeatedly.

9. It appears that the CA report is awaiting. The applicant's birth date is 23.06.2001. The applicant is 24 yrs old. It appears prima facie that the applicant had committed aggravated penetrative sexual assault and due to which the victim had become pregnant. Mere application of the mother of the applicant to the Supdt of Police at this stage is of no use to the applicant. As

discussed above, the CA report is awaiting and the investigation is in progress. The incident is not only of the day 06.03.2026, but even prior to that on earlier occasions. Prima facie it appears that, the applicant has established physical relations with the victim. Therefore, in such circumstances, it is not just and proper to release the applicant on bail. Hence, application is to be rejected, with this, I proceed to pass the following order -

ORDER

- 1] The application is rejected.
- 2] Criminal Bail Application No. 205/2026 stands disposed of.
