ORAL ORDER BELOW EXH. 3

1. This is an application for bail under Section 483 of the Bhartiya Nagarik Suraksha Sanhita, 2023.
2. Heard the learned counsel for the accused and the learned A.P.P for the State. Perused the record.
3. It is submitted by the learned counsel for the accused that the FIR came to be lodged due to the dispute, which took place between the father of the victim and the accused. An NC came to be lodged by the accused. There are no criminal antecedents against him.
4. *Per contra*, it is submitted by the learned APP that the accused sent obscene messages on the mobile phone of the victim. The accused made gestures towards the victim. As per the say filed by the informant, the accused intimidated the family of the informant. He is likely to repeat similar crime. He is likely to endanger the lives of the informant and the victim.
5. As per the FIR, the accused, who is aged about 37 years, used to follow the victim, who is aged about 15 years and 8 months and used to make obscene gestures towards her. He is said

to have sent an obscene message on the mobile handset possessed by the victim. Thereafter, he is said to have again followed the victim.

6. Investigation is complete. Charge sheet is filed. Considering the nature of the crime, the accused deserves to be enlarged on bail, due to which, due to which, I proceed to pass the following order.

ORDER

1. The application is hereby allowed.
2. The accused be released on bail, on his executing PR. bond of ₹.25,000/- [₹. Twenty Five Thousand Only], with one surety in the like amount, in the aforesaid crime, on the following conditions:-
 - (i) The accused shall not tamper with the prosecution witnesses in any manner.
 - (ii) The accused shall not indulge into any similar crime.
