O R D E R

The above named accused have filed this application for
grant of regular bail under Section 483 of Bharatiya Nagarik Suraksha

(Neetika Verma, ASJ, SAS Nagar, UID no. PB0209)

Sanhita (hereinafter referred to as BNSS) in case FIR No. 0036 dated 19.05.2026 under Sections 140, 115(2), 126, 190 BNS registered at Police Station Sadar Kurali, District SAS Nagar.

2. Notice of the bail application was issued to the State and police record was requisitioned.

3. Carried out. It was reported that neither any bail application relating to the accused/applicant was pending nor decided. Ahlmad had also reported the same according to the information available in the CIS system.

ABSTRACT OF FIR:

4. The above referred FIR was registered at the instance of complainant Bhupinderpal Kaur wife of Karam Singh, resident of Village Singhpura, Police Station Sadar Kurali, District SAS Nagar, who contended that she is a retired teacher from Punjab School Education Board. She has one son namely Ravi Inder Singh and his marriage took place about 11 years ago with Prabhjot Kaur daughter of Davinder Singh, resident of village Purkhali, Police Station Sadar Rupnagar, District Rupnagar. Her son Ravi Inder Singh is having two children, out of whom elder girl namely Ravi Jot aged about 5 years was adopted from their known Sushma wife of Raghubir Singh S/o Gian Chand, resident of Village Bijanpur, Police Station Dera Bassi, District Mohali and adopted through Kharar Tehsil. Now, about 6

months ago, her daughter-in-law Prabhjot Kaur wife of her son Ravi Inder Singh, after fighting and quarreling with her son and them, left for her parental home in Village Purkhali and is living with her mother alongwith complainant's grandson Udayvir Singh, aged about 9 months and filed a custody case of Ravi Jot Kaur in Kharar Court. Ravi Jot Kaur is living with them and is studying in LKG class at National Public School, Morinda Road. On 19.05.2026, the complainant along with her husband Karam Singh, at around 12:40 PM, like every day, went to National Public School Morinda Road to pick up her daughter Ravi Jot Kaur. When they reached their house and stopped in front of their house and was about to open the gate, one Bajaj Platina motorcycle black in colour came from behind, driven by a Sikh man with a woman sitting behind him. The face of Sikh man was not covered and the woman's face was muffled and they stopped in front of their scooter and prevented them from entering their house and started snatching complainant's grand daughter Ravi Jot Kaur forcefully and when they started shouting, suddenly one car make Honda white colour stopped there and out of the car, three persons came out and out of which one person's head and face was covered, but his two accomplices were Gurdarshan Singh and Bikramjeet Singh son of Davinder Singh, r/o village Purkhali Police station Sadar District Rupnagar and inside their car, one lady with head and face covered was also sitting and they can identify them if they come in front of them and the three persons came out of the car and snatched their

granddaughter and sat in the car and went away. They recognized the driver of the car as Sandeep Kumar R/o village Kurarhi, District Mohali and he with intention of running them over with car, drove the car back first and then forward to ram it into them with intention to give injuries and due to which they had received injuries and they both fell down and while falling down, the complainant managed to note down the car number as CH-01-AA-1754, but they could not read the number of the motorcycle. Thereafter, the motorcycle rider also fled away from the spot. Thereafter, they were admitted in Government Hospital, Kurali. On the basis of it, the present FIR was registered.

ARGUMENTS RAISED BY LEARNED COUNSEL FOR APPLICANT/ACCUSED:

5. Contention of learned counsel for the accused-applicant is that the accused/applicant has been falsely implicated in the present FIR. The entire dispute pertains to the custody of minor Ravijot Kaur, aged 4½ years. The child's father is Ravi Inder Singh and mother is Prabhjot Kaur. The applicant/accused is the real paternal uncle (mama) of the child and there is no question of kidnapping the child or abducting the child in order to murder or for ransom etc. It is contended that due to matrimonial discord, the child's mother Prabhjot Kaur has been residing separately at her parental home in village Purkhali for the last 6 months alongwith her younger son. The minor Ravijot Kaur was residing with her grandparents and father at village Singhpura. The sister of the petitioner has also filed a Domestic Violence case against

her husband and in-laws. The accused/applicant was arrested in this case on 03.07.2026 and is in custody since then. It has been contended that the completion of investigation and conclusion of trial is likely to take considerable time and as such, no useful purpose will be served by keeping the accused/applicant behind the bars. The accused/applicant has further contended that he will abide by all the terms and conditions as imposed by the court and finally, it has been prayed that the accused/applicant may be granted bail.

ARGUMENTS OF LEARNED ADDL. PUBLIC PROSECUTOR

6. On the other hand, while controverting the contentions put-forth by the counsel for accused, learned Additional PP for the State argued that the serious allegations have been leveled against the applicant/accused. He further argued that if the concession of bail is granted to the applicant/accused, he may try to interfere in fair investigation and influence the prosecution witnesses. Hence, the applicant/accused does not deserve the leniency of the Court and should not be granted relief of bail.

DISCUSSION:

7. Perusal of the contents of the FIR as well as the entire police record, it surfaces that there is a matrimonial dispute between Ravi Inder Singh and Prabhjot Kaur and the parties are into litigation over the custody of the minor child Ravijot Kaur. The petition for claiming the custody of the minor child under Section 8 of the Guardian and Wards Act is pending adjudication before the Family

Court at Kharar. The minor had already been recovered and her custody had been handed over to her father. From the entire factual matrix on record, keeping in view the fact that the allegations of kidnapping of the minor are upon the minor's mother and her maternal family members, at this stage, no bad intention of the mother to cause hurt to her own minor child is made out. The accused Prabhjot Kaur has also filed a complaint against her husband and father-in-law and mother-in-law under the Domestic Violence Act and copy of the same has been placed on record. The proving of the ingredients of the offence of kidnapping by the mother of the child are yet to be proved and is a debatable question keeping in view of the facts of the present case. The mother is also a lawful guardian of the minor child. The accused/applicant Vikramjeet Singh is the maternal uncle of the minor, who is alleged to have been kidnapped by her mother. The custody of the minor has been restored to her father.

8. The accused/applicant is in custody since 03.07.2026. Presentation of challan and conclusion of trial will take considerable time. No useful purpose will be served by detaining accused/applicant behind the bars as the same would be a burden on Government exchequer. In such circumstances, without commenting on the merits of the case, the present application as moved by the accused/applicant **Vikramjeet Singh @ Bikramjeet Singh** is allowed and he is admitted to bail on furnishing of bail bonds and surety bonds in the

sum of Rs.80,000/- with one surety in the like amount before the Illaqa Magistrate/Duty Magistrate upon the following conditions-

- 1. that the accused/applicant shall attend the Court on each and every date of hearing;*
- 2. that the accused/applicant shall not commit an offence similar to the offence of which he is accused, or suspected, of the commission of which he is suspected;*
- 3. that the accused/applicant shall not directly or indirectly make an inducement, threat or promise to any person acquainted with the facts of the case so as to dissuade him from disclosing such facts to the Court or to any police officer or tamper with the evidence; and*
- 4. that the accused/applicant shall not leave the country without prior permission of Court.*

A copy of this order be sent to the learned Area Magistrate/Duty Magistrate concerned for compliance. A soft copy of this bail order be sent by email to the accused/applicant through the jail superintendent immediately.

8. It is made clear that none of the observation made by this court would ever influence the decision of the court on merits of the case. Papers be attached with the remand papers/challan pending if any or be consigned to the record room. Police record be returned forthwith.
