This petition filed on behalf of the petitioner to release him on bail u/s.483 of BNSS.

This petition is coming on this day for final hearing before this Court in the presence of **Thiru. M. Abdul Rahman**, Advocate for the Petitioner/ Accused and **Thiru. V. Ravichandran, Public Prosecutor**, represented for State, upon perusing the petition submitted and upon hearing both side arguments, this Court pronounced the following:-

ORDER

Heard both side.

The petitioner is the accused in Crime No.48/2026 of Kuniyamuthur Police Station, for the alleged offence u/s.191(2), 191(3), 296(b), 115(2), 109, 351(3) of BNS, he has filed this petition, seeking grant of bail.

2. The learned counsel for the petitioner submitted that this petitioner is the common friend of defacto complainant party and accused party. There is no

specific allegation against the petitioner. Further in this case, victims have been discharged from the hospital. The petitioner is innocent and he has been falsely implicated in this case and he is ready to abide any condition and he is in judicial custody for the past 25 days and prays to enlarge the petitioner on bail.

3. The learned Public Prosecutor submitted that there are six accused in this case. **The petitioner is arrayed as A-4.** All the accused are friends. The defacto complainant and the accused are known persons. There was a prior enmity between the defacto complainant's friend and the accused. While so, on the date of occurrence, i.e., on 13-02-2026, the defacto complainant and his friends went to the place of occurrence and at that time, all the accused came to the said place and picked up quarrel with the defacto complainant and his friends and attacked them with bare hands and leg and further A-1 and A-2 attacked the defacto complainant and two others with knife and caused blood injuries to them and criminally intimidated them. In this case, three victims including the defacto complainant sustained injuries and they have been admitted in the hospital on 13-02-2026 and discharged on 25-02-2026 [2 victims] and 20-02-2026 [another victim]. No previous case is reported against the petitioner. Investigation is still pending.

4. After considering the submissions, considering the nature of offence, having regard to the circumstance under which occurrence had taken place, considering the period of custody undergone by the petitioner, as victims have been discharged from the hospital, no previous case is attributed against the petitioner, **this Court is inclined to grant bail to the petitioner subject to the following conditions:-**

(i) The petitioner is ordered to be enlarged on bail on his executing a bond for Rs.10,000/- with two sureties for a like sum each to the satisfaction of the Judicial Magistrate No.7, Coimbatore.

(ii) The sureties shall affix their photographs and Left Thumb Impression in the surety bond and the Magistrate may obtain a copy of their Aadhaar Card or Bank Pass Book to ensure their identity.

(iii) The petitioner is directed to sign before the respondent police, daily at 10.00 a.m. for a period of 15 days.

(iv) The petitioner shall not abscond either during investigation or trial.

(v) The petitioner shall not tamper with evidence or witness either during investigation or trial.

(vi) On breach of any of the aforesaid conditions, the learned Magistrate / Trial Court is entitled to take appropriate action against the petitioner in accordance with law as if the conditions have been imposed and the petitioner released on bail by the learned Magistrate / Trial Court himself as laid down by the Hon'ble Supreme Court in **P.K.Shaji /vs/ State of Kerala [(2005) AIR SCW 5560]**.

(vii) If the accused thereafter abscond, a fresh FIR can be registered under Section 269 of BNS.
