This petition filed on behalf of the petitioner to release him on bail u/s.483 of BNSS.

This petition is coming on this day for final hearing before this Court in the presence of **Tmt. / Selvi. N. Radhika**, Advocate for the Petitioner/ Accused and **Thiru. V. Ravichandran, Public Prosecutor**, represented for State, upon perusing the petition submitted and upon hearing both side arguments, this Court pronounced the following:-

ORDER

Heard both side.

The petitioner is the accused in Crime No.373/2025 of Kuniyamuthur Police Station, for the alleged offence u/s.296(b), 109(1) of BNS and Sec.4 of TNPHW Act, he has filed this petition, seeking grant of bail.

2. Previous bail petition filed by the petitioner in C.M.P.No.799/2026 was dismissed by this Court on 02-03-2026 and this is the second bail petition.

3. The case of the prosecution is that before two and half years, the defacto complainant and the petitioner are having love affair and subsequently it was broken by the defacto complainant due to the misbehavior of the petitioner. Enraged over the same, the petitioner insisted the defacto complainant to continue the relationship. While so, on 11-07-2023, when the defacto complainant was standing in front of Honda Show Room, Lakshmi Mill, the petitioner came there and stabbed the defacto complainant with knife and Race Course police has registered in this regard. Similarly, in on 30-08-2025, the petitioner attacked the defacto complainant with aruval and caused injuries and Kuniyamuthur Police registered a case in this regard. While so, on 22-11-2025, the petitioner again attacked the defacto complainant with knife and caused injuries to her. Hence, the present case.

4. The learned counsel for the petitioner submitted that in this case, after completing investigation, the respondent police filed charge sheet and the same was taken on file. The learned counsel for the petitioner has further submitted that the petitioner is innocent and he has been falsely implicated in this case and he never indulged in any such activities as alleged and he is ready to abide any condition and he is in judicial custody for the past 110 days and prays to enlarge the petitioner on bail.

5. Opposing to grant bail to the petitioner, the learned Public Prosecutor submitted that before two and half years, the defacto complainant and the petitioner are having love affair and subsequently it was broken by the defacto complainant due to the misbehavior of the petitioner. Enraged over the same, the petitioner insisted the defacto complainant to continue the relationship. While so, on 11-07-2023, when the defacto complainant was standing in front of Honda Show Room, Lakshmi Mill, the petitioner came there and stabbed the defacto complainant with knife and Race Course police has registered in this regard. Similarly, in on 30-08-2025, the petitioner attacked the defacto complainant with aruval and caused injuries and Kuniyamuthur Police registered a case in this regard. After enlarged on bail in the said case, on 22-11-2025, the petitioner again attacked the defacto complainant with knife and caused injuries to her. The learned Public Prosecutor has further submitted that before the present occurrence, two times the petitioner attempted to murder the defacto complainant and **two other cases have been registered against the petitioner in this regard in Crime No.291/2022 of Race Course Police Station, for the offence u/s.447 and 307 of IPC and Crime No.271/2025, of Kuniyamuthur Police Station, for the offence u/s.296(b), 109(1) of BNS and Sec.4 of TNPHW Act. In the Race Course case, charge sheet filed and case is pending in S.C.No.212/2024 before II ASJ Court, Coimbatore and another case is pending in investigation stage. In this case,**

after completing investigation, the respondent police filed charge sheet and the same was taken on file in PRC No.35/2026.

6. The learned Public Prosecutor has further submitted that the petitioner has filed bail petition before the Hon'ble High Court of Madras on 27-02-2026 and before that on 25-02-2026, the petitioner filed bail petition before this Court. This Court dismissed the bail petition on 02-03-2026. The Hon'ble High Court of Madras dismissed the bail petition on 04-03-2026. During the pendency of the bail petition before the Hon'ble High Court of Madras, the petitioner filed the present petition before this Court on 03-03-2026.

7. After considering the submissions, considering the nature of offence, though the petitioner is in judicial custody for the past 110 days and the respondent police filed charge sheet before the concerned Court, considering the circumstance under which the occurrence had taken place, having regard to the bad antecedents of the petitioner, as the petitioner has filed two similar applications before the Hon'ble High Court of Madras as well as before this Court simultaneously, this Court is not inclined to grant bail to the petitioner.

Hence, this petition is dismissed.
