This petition filed on behalf of the petitioner to release him on bail u/s.483 of BNSS.

This petition is coming on this day for final hearing before this Court in the presence of **Thiru. L. Manoj Kumar**, Advocate for the Petitioner/ A-1 and **Thiru. V. Ravichandran, Public Prosecutor**, represented for State, upon perusing the petition submitted and upon hearing both side arguments, this Court pronounced the following:-

ORDER

Heard both side.

The petitioner is the accused in Crime No.25/2026 of Kuniyamuthur Police Station, for the alleged offence u/s.8(C), 20(b)(ii)(A), 29(1) of NDPS Act and 123 of BNS, he has filed this petition, seeking grant of bail.

2. Already this Court dismissed two bail petitions filed by the petitioner and this is the third bail petition.

3. The case of the prosecution is that there are two accused in this case. A-1 is used to sell hemp to the general public and students. A-2 purchased hemp from

A-1. A-1 purchased hemp from North Indians. In this case, the accused illegally possessed 200 grams of hemp. Hence, the present case.

4. The learned counsel for the petitioner submitted that in this case, the Hon'ble High Court of Madras granted bail to the co-accused vide order in CrI.O.P.No.3676/2026, dated 16-02-2026. The learned counsel has further submitted that the petitioner is innocent and he has been falsely implicated in this case and he never indulged in any such activities as alleged and he is ready to abide any condition and he is in judicial custody for the past 48 days and prays to enlarge the petitioner on bail.

5. Opposed to grant bail to the petitioner, the learned Public Prosecutor submitted that there are two accused in this case. **The petitioner is arrayed as A-1.** A-1 is used to sell hemp to the general public and students. A-2 purchased hemp from A-1. A-1 purchased hemp from North Indians. The learned Public Prosecutor has further submitted that on the date of occurrence, on receipt of secret information regarding the sale of hemp, the respondent police went to the place of occurrence and caught A-1 red-handed. In this case, the accused illegally possessed 200 grams of hemp. The learned Public Prosecutor has further submitted that on enquiry, it came to know that A-2 is involved in sale of hemp to the general public and college students and two numbers of student had given statement before the respondent police. **Except the present case, the petitioner is involved in another case which is similar in nature.** The Hon'ble High Court of Madras has granted bail to the co-accused who is having one previous case which is registered for the offence of extortion. Investigation is still pending.

6. After considering the submissions, considering the nature of offence, though the petitioner is in judicial custody for the past 48 days, considering the nature of allegation leveled against the petitioner, having regard to the quantum of hemp recovered in this case, considering the bad antecedents of the petitioner, as investigation is still going on, this Court is not inclined to grant bail to the petitioner.

Hence, this petition is dismissed.
