This petition has been filed through **e-Filing** on behalf of the petitioners to release them on anticipatory bail u/s.482 of BNSS.

This petition is coming on this day for final hearing before this Court in the presence of **Tvl. B. Kalanithi and D. Balamurugan**, Advocates for the Petitioners/ Accused and **Thiru. V. Ravichandran, Public Prosecutor**, represented for State, upon perusing the petition submitted and upon hearing both side arguments, this Court pronounced the following:-

ORDER

Heard both side.

The petitioners are the accused in Crime No.76/2026 of Thadagam Police Station, since they are apprehending arrest in the hands of the respondent police for the alleged u/s.296(b), 118(1), 351(3) of BNS, they have filed this petition, seeking grant of Anticipatory bail.

2. The learned counsel for the petitioners has submitted that, with an intention to wreak vengeance due to the business development and growth of the petitioners, the defacto complainant lodged this false complaint. On the date of alleged occurrence, the defacto complainant and his parties only attacked the 1st petitioner and caused serious injuries to him. Subsequently, in order to escape from the serious offence committed by his wife and son and to falsely implicate the petitioners, the defacto complainant admitted himself in the government hospital without any injury and lodged this false complaint. The 2nd petitioner gave birth to a girl baby only on 30-01-2026. The 3rd petitioner is an aged person. The petitioners will not abscond and tamper the witnesses and pray for grant of anticipatory bail to them.

3. The learned Public Prosecutor has submitted that, there is a case and counter case and in the counter case, the defacto complainant and others who arrayed as accused, were granted anticipatory bail by this Court in CMP No.891/2026 dated 09-03-2026. As far as this case is concerned, the victim was admitted in the hospital on 19-02-2026 and discharged from the hospital on 21-02-2026. No previous case is pending against the petitioners.

4. Heard. As per the prosecution case, due to prior enmity, the accused abused the defacto complainant in filthy language and assaulted him and threatened with dire consequences. There is a case and counter case for the same incident. In this case, the victim had been discharged from the hospital. There is no previous case is attributed against the petitioners. Considering the submission, the fact that the victim was discharged from the hospital, the petitioners have no previous case, and in the counter case, the accused therein had already been granted anticipatory bail, since the petitioners apprehend arrest at the hands of the respondent police, **this Court is inclined to grant anticipatory bail to the petitioners subject to the following conditions:-**

(i) Anticipatory bail is granted to the petitioners.

(ii) The petitioners shall execute bond for Rs.10,000/- each in the event of their arrest or the petitioners shall surrender before the Judicial Magistrate No.1, Coimbatore and execute bond of Rs.10,000/- each within 15 days from the date of this order, failing which the anticipatory bail granted to the petitioners shall stand automatically cancelled.

(iii) The petitioners shall produce two sureties for likesum each to the value of Rs.10,000/- each to the satisfaction of the Judicial Magistrate No.1, Coimbatore

within 15 days from the date of this order, failing which the anticipatory bail granted to the petitioners shall stand automatically cancelled.

(iv) The sureties shall affix their photographs and Left Thumb Impression in the surety bond and the Magistrate may obtain a copy of their Aadhar Card or Bank Pass Book to ensure their identity.

(v) The petitioners are directed to sign before the respondent police, daily at 10.00 a.m. for a period of 15 days.

(vi) The petitioners shall not abscond either during investigation or trial.

(vii) The petitioners shall not tamper with evidence or witness either during investigation or trial.

(viii) On breach of any of the aforesaid conditions, the learned Magistrate / Trial Court is entitled to take appropriate action against the petitioners in accordance with law as if the conditions have been imposed and the petitioners released on bail by the learned Magistrate / Trial Court himself as laid down by the Hon'ble Supreme Court in **P.K.Shaji /vs/ State of Kerala [(2005) AIR SCW 5560]**.

(ix) If the accused thereafter abscond, a fresh FIR can be registered under Section 269 of BNS.
