This petition has been filed through **e-Filing** on behalf of the petitioner to release him on anticipatory bail u/s.482 of BNS.

This petition is coming on this day for final hearing before this Court in the presence of **Tvl. S. Ahamed Asarudeen and A. Juhi Nashrin**, Advocates for the Petitioner/ A-4 and **Thiru. V. Ravichandran, Public Prosecutor**, represented for State, upon perusing the petition submitted and upon hearing both side arguments, this Court pronounced the following:-

ORDER

Heard both side.

The petitioner is the accused in Crime No.2/2026 of DCB Police Station, since he is apprehending arrest in the hands of the respondent police for the alleged u/s.61(2)(a), 336(3), 340(2), 318(4) of BNS, he has filed this petition, seeking grant of Anticipatory bail.

2. The learned counsel for the petitioner has submitted that the petitioner has not committed any offence as alleged and he has been falsely implicated in this case. The earlier anticipatory bail application filed by the petitioner was dismissed by this

Court in CMP No.834/2026 on 04-03-2026. The change of circumstance is that, in this case, A-2 was enlarged on bail by the learned Judicial Magistrate No.6, Coimbatore in CMP No.1622/2026 on 02-03-2026. The petitioner is ready to abide any conditions imposed by this Court and prays for grant of anticipatory bail to him.

3. The learned Public Prosecutor has submitted that the earlier anticipatory bail application filed by the petitioner was dismissed by this Court on 04-03-2026 and there is no change of circumstance after the dismissal of the earlier application and opposed to grant anticipatory bail to the petitioner.

4. Heard. As per the prosecution case, the accused cheated the defacto complainant a sum of Rs.2.5 crore by giving false promise. It is the contention of the petitioner that, in this case, co-accused namely A-2 was enlarged on bail by the learned Judicial Magistrate on 02-03-2026 and the petitioner is ready to abide any conditions imposed by this Court and prays for grant of anticipatory bail to him. Per contra, the learned Public Prosecutor contended that, as the said A-2 has to look after 2 years old child, hence she has been enlarged on bail by the learned Judicial Magistrate, the petitioner is arrayed as A-4 in this case and he is the friend of A-1 and in this case, all the other accused have been arrested and the petitioner is absconding and in this case, huge amount involved and the amount is not yet recovered and strongly opposed to grant anticipatory bail to the petitioner. After considering all the above said aspects, considering the nature of offence, gravity of the offence and considering the fact that huge amount involved in this case, and further though the petitioner contended that, co-accused had already been enlarged on bail, she has been enlarged on bail after the period of incarceration, hence the petitioner cannot claim at par with them, **hence this Court is not inclined to grant anticipatory bail to the petitioner.**

Hence this petition is dismissed.
