This petition filed on behalf of the petitioner to release him on bail u/s.483 of BNSS.

This petition is coming on this day for final hearing before this Court in the presence of **Thiru. K. Jothi Prasanth**, Advocate for the Petitioner / A-2 and **Thiru. V. Ravichandran, Public Prosecutor**, represented for State, upon perusing the petition submitted and upon hearing both side arguments, this Court pronounced the following:-

**ORDER**

**Heard both side.**

The petitioner is the accused in Crime No.739/2025 of Peelamedu Police Station, for the alleged offence u/s.316(2) and 318(4) of BNS, he has filed this petition, seeking grant of bail.

2. Previous bail petition filed by the petitioner in C.M.P.No.843/2026 was dismissed on 04-03-2026 and this is the second bail petition.

3. The learned counsel for the petitioner submitted that this petitioner is arrayed as A-2. A-1 is the main person in this case and there is no specific allegation against this petitioner. Further A-1 was enlarged on bail by the learned Judicial Magistrate No.2, Coimbatore vide order in C.M.P.No.11959/2025, dated 10-12-2025. The petitioner is innocent and he is the sole bread winner of his family and he never indulged in any such activities as alleged and his wife is having health issues and no one is available to look after her and he is in judicial custody for the past 27 days and prays to enlarge the petitioner on bail.

4. Opposing to grant bail to the petitioner, the learned Public Prosecutor submitted that there are two accused in this case. **The petitioner is arrayed as A-2.** In this case, A-1 was enlarged on bail by the learned Judicial Magistrate concerned, after completion of 56 days custody period. The learned Public Prosecutor has further submitted that the defacto complainant is the HR Manager in “JP Associate Asia Pacific Private Limited”. A-1 is the Brand Manager of the defacto complainant’s company for Colgate Sales. A-2 is Salesman. A-1 is the Head of the team and his work is to receive the amount from his subordinate and deposit the said amount in the company account. A-2 is used to get purchase order from customers and collect the amount from the customers and accordingly both the accused conspired together received the amount from the customers and failed to remit the same in the company account and accordingly the accused had cheated the defacto complainant company to the tune of Rs.24,35,384/-. Except the present case, the petitioner is involved in another case. As of now, no amount is recovered. Investigation is still pending.

5. After considering the submissions, considering the nature of offence, though the petitioner is in judicial custody for the past 27 days, considering the manner in which offence has been committed, considering the quantum of amount involved in this case, as investigation is still pending and amount is not yet recovered, this Court is not inclined to grant bail to the petitioner.

**Hence, this petition is dismissed.**
