These two petitions filed on behalf of the petitioners in the respective petitions to release them on bail u/s.483 of BNSS.

These two petitions are coming on this day for final hearing before this Court in the presence of **Thiru. R. Krishnan**, Advocate for the Petitioner in C.M.P.No.2298/2026 / A-1 and **Thiru. M. Jeyabal**, Advocate for the Petitioner in C.M.P.No.2319/2026 / A-2 and **Thiru. N.Manojkumar, Public Prosecutor**, represented for State, upon perusing the petitions submitted and upon hearing both side arguments, this Court pronounced the following:-

COMMON ORDER

Heard both side.

The petitioner in the respective petitions are the accused in Crime No.23/2026 of AWPS Karumathampatti Police Station, for the alleged offences u/s.70(1), 351(3) of BNS, they have filed these two petitions separately, seeking grant of bail.

2. The learned counsel for the petitioner in the respective petitions submitted that the petitioner in C.M.P.No.2298/2026 is arrayed as A-1 and the petitioner in

C.M.P.No.2319/2026 is arrayed as A-2. A-1 was working as a business development office in a private company and he was staying a rental room. The defacto complainant stayed nearby room of A-1 and she wantonly introduced with A-1 and thereafter, both them become friends and they went to public places only for taking the reels. While so, the defacto complainant tried to come very close to A-1 on various occasions and at that time, A-1 duly avoided the same. In the meantime, A-1's marriage proposal was held and enraged over the same, in order to stop the same, the defacto complainant lodged a false complaint against A-1 and A-2. No such occurrence had taken place as alleged by the defacto complainant and there is no piece of evidence to show that A-1 and A-2 had committed the offence. The learned counsel has further submitted that the petitioner in the respective petitions are innocent and they have been falsely implicated in this case and they never indulged in any such activities as alleged and they are ready to abide any condition and they are in judicial custody for the past 20 days and 19 days respectively and prayed to enlarge the petitioner in the respective petitions on bail.

3. The learned Public Prosecutor submitted that there are two accused in this case. **The petitioner in C.M.P.no.2298/2026 is arrayed as A-1. The petitioner in C.M.P.No.2319/2026 is arrayed as A-2.** A-1 and A-2 are friends. Initially A-1 and the defacto complainant are having relationship and at that time, A-1 had given false promise for marriage and had physical relationship with the defcato complainant. Subsequently A-1 started to avoid the defacto complainant since, A-1's family members made arrangement for his marriage. While so, on 10-04-2026, A-1 and A-2 mixed some drugs in the juice and offered the same to the defacto complainant and after drinking the same, the defacto complainant become fainted and at that time, both the accused had committed the offence. Investigation is still pending.

4. After considering the submissions, considering the nature of offence, though the petitioner in the respective petitions are in judicial custody nearly 20 days, considering the nature of allegation leveled against them, as investigation is still pending, this Court is not inclined to grant bail to the petitioner in the respective petitions.

Hence, both petitions are dismissed.
