This Execution petition came up for final hearing before me on 20<sup>th</sup> of April 2026 in the presence of Thiru. D. Sathish Shankar, Advocate for the Petitioner and Thiru. Gopalakrishnan for the Respondent and upon perusing the entire case records and upon hearing the arguments, and having stood over till this day for consideration, this court passed the following:-

**ORDER**

The petitioner, Mr. P. Mani, has filed the present application seeking to send for the amount of Rs. 8,00,000/- lying in the Court deposit. The petitioner is employed under the respondent and had earlier preferred a computation petition before the Principal Labour Court, Coimbatore, in C.P. No. 81 of 2017, wherein the Court ordered payment of 50% of the back wages amounting to Rs. 15,53,584/- to the petitioner, directing the respondent to pay the said amount within three months, failing which the respondent would be liable to pay interest at the rate of 9% per annum. As the respondent failed to comply with the said order, the petitioner filed this execution petition seeking attachment and sale of the movable properties of the respondent management to recover the amount due. Aggrieved thereby, the respondent management preferred a writ petition in W.P. No. 16105 of 2021, wherein the Hon'ble High Court directed the deposit of a sum of Rs. 8,00,000/- as a condition for grant of stay, and the said direction was duly complied with. Subsequently, the writ petition was disposed of on 24.04.2025, modifying the earlier order of the Principal Labour Court, Coimbatore, passed in C.P. No. 81 of 2017 dated 12.02.2020, by directing the respondent to pay 50% of the back wages for the period from 1998 to 05.06.2015, without interest, within a period of four weeks from the date of receipt of a copy of the order and to settle the terminal benefits, failing which the respondent was directed to pay the back wages along

with interest at the rate of 6% per annum. Now, the petitioner has filed the present application seeking to send for the amount of Rs. 8,00,000/- lying in the Court deposit, and the respondent has not chosen to file any counter and no appeal is pending before any forum. Considering the entire facts and circumstances of the case, this Court is of the considered view that the petition deserves to be allowed in the interest of justice.

**In the result, E.A. No. 1 of 2026 stands allowed. The amount of Rs. 8,00,000/- along with accrued interest is hereby ordered to be send for from the Court deposit as prayed for.**
