This petition came before me in the presence of Tmt.V.Shanthi, B.A., B.L., Learned Counsel for the petitioner/accused and Tmt.K.Jayanthi, M.B.A., B.L., Learned Assistant Public Prosecutor for the State and after hearing both sides, this court delivered the following :

**ORDER**

1. This Petition has been filed u/s.480 of BNSS Act 2023 seeking bail for the petitioner/accused.
2. Heard the Learned Assistant Public Prosecutor and the Learned counsel for the petitioner and perused the reply given by the Learned Assistant Public Prosecutor and the respondent police.
3. The Learned Counsel for the petitioner/accused has submitted that the petitioner/accused was remanded on 31.01.2026 and he is under judicial custody for the past 40 days and that the petitioner/accused is innocent and has not committed any offence and he has been falsely implicated in this case and the petitioner is ready to obey any conditions imposed by the court if he is released on bail.
4. On the other hand, the Learned Assistant Public Prosecutor has submitted that the investigation is not yet completed and the petitioner/accused had break opened the shop of the defacto complainant and committed theft of wire coil and pipe fittings and caused loss to the defacto complainant and the petitioner/accused has 9 previous cases pending in Sulur PS 1.Cr.No.450/2022 for offence u/s.457,380 IPC, 2.471/2024 for offence u/s.454,380 IPC, 3.1338/2020 for offence u/s.454, 380 IPC, 4.738/2019 for offence

u/s.454, 380 IPC, 5.Perur PS r.No.35/2025 for offence u/s.331(4), 62 BNS, 6.Madukarai PS Cr.No.33/2023 for offence u/s.457, 380, 511 IPC, 7.Erode, Perundurai PS Cr.No.216/2025 for offence u/s.331(3), 305(a) BNS, 8.Singanallur PS Cr.No.31/2024 for offence u/s.457, 380 IPC and 9.Vadavalli PS Cr.No.79/2025 for offence u/s.454,380 IPC and if the petitioner/accused is enlarged on bail, he will do the same offence again and he will tamper the witnesses and hamper the evidence and may abscond and will not appear before this court and hence, strongly objected to release the petitioner/accused on bail.

5. On perusal of the records, it reveals that the petitioner/accused was remanded to judicial custody on 31.01.2026 and he is in judicial custody for the past 40 days. Considering the nature of offence and on considering the previous antecedents of the accused and considering the gravity of the offence, this court is not inclined to allow this bail application.
6. **In result**, this petition stands dismissed.
