This petition for bail coming on this day for hearing before me, M/s.K.Sundaramoorthy, the learned counsel appearing for the petitioner/accused and of M/s.R.Thirumurugan, the learned Public Prosecutor appearing for the respondent/complainant, upon hearing both sides and upon perusal of case records, this Court made the following

ORDER

This petition is filed U/s.480 and 483 of BNSS 2023, seeking to enlarge the petitioner on bail.

2. The petitioner/accused is facing charges for the alleged offences U/s.126(2), 309(4), 311 and 351(3) of BNS - 2023.

3. Notice given to the Public Prosecutor for the State and the reply received. Heard both sides. Records are perused.

4. The learned counsel for the petitioner would submit that the petitioner/accused was arrested and remanded to judicial custody on 04.03.2026 (*) and he is under judicial custody for the past 34 days; he is

ready to abide by any conditions to be imposed upon him and he is ready to offer substantial sureties before the court thereby prayed for enlargement on bail.

5. The learned Public Prosecutor, on the other hand, strongly objected to grant bail to the petitioner by stating that on, 18.01.2026 at 07.00 a.m. in the morning this petitioner along with others wrongfully restrained the defacto complainant and demanded money, since he refused, the accused uttered abusive words towards him, beaten him, robbed a sum of Rs.700/- from his shirt pocket at knife point and also threatened him with dire consequences and fled away. Moreover, the petitioner was detained under Tamil Nadu Act 14 of 1982 by the Commissioner of Police, Greater Chennai as per the order in No.03/BBCDEFGISSSV No.197/2026 dated 01.04.2026 and prays for the dismissal of the petition. He also filed the copy of the said detention order.

6. Taking into consideration of the gravity of the offence, the nature of allegations raised against the petitioner/accused, the petitioner was detained under Tamil Nadu Act 14 of 1982 and also considering the other facts and circumstances of the case, this court is not inclined to grant bail to the petitioner. **Accordingly, this petition is dismissed.**
