This petition for anticipatory bail coming on this day for hearing before me, M/s.V.Mani, the learned counsel is appearing for the petitioner/accused, and of M/s.R.Thirumurugan, the learned Public Prosecutor is appearing for the respondent/complainant, upon hearing both sides and upon perusal of case records, this Court made the following:

ORDER

This petition is filed by the petitioner/accused U/s.482 of B.N.S.S. praying to enlarge the petitioner on anticipatory bail.

2. The petitioner/accused apprehends arrest at the hands of respondent police for the alleged offences U/s.126(2), 296(b), 118(1), 351(3) of BNS, 2023 in connection with Cr. No.170 of 2026 of respondent Police Station.

3. Notice given to the Public Prosecutor for the State and the reply

submitted. Heard both sides. Records perused.

4. The learned counsel appearing for the petitioner/accused would submit that the petitioner/accused are innocent of offence, he is falsely implicated in this case; the injured person has been discharged from the hospital; moreover, the petitioner is ready to abide by any conditions to be imposed upon him and he is ready to offer substantial sureties before the court, thereby praying to grant anticipatory bail to the petitioner.

5. The learned Public Prosecutor, on the other hand, would submit that during night hours, the petitioner along with other accused have waylaid the defacto complainant and his friends, abused them with filthy words, attacked the defacto complainant with knife and caused injuries and also threatened them with dire consequences and prays for the dismissal of the petition. However, he fairly admits that the injured person has been discharged from the hospital.

6. It is seen, the occurrence has taken place on 24.04.2026. The learned Public Prosecutor admitted that the injured person has been discharged from the hospital, therefore, substantial portion of investigation ought to have been completed. Except the offence U/s.118(1) of BNS, 2023, other offences are bailable. The petitioner seemed to be the first offender, no previous case is pending against him. Taking into consideration the nature of allegations levelled against the petitioner, injured person has been discharged from hospital and also considering the overall facts and circumstances of the case, this court is inclined to grant anticipatory bail to the Petitioner.

7. **In the result, this petition is allowed;** the petitioner, in the event of arrest or his surrender before the Judicial Magistrate No.II, Tambaram within 15 days, is ordered to be released on bail on his execution of bond for a sum

of Rs.10,000/- with two sureties for a like sum, to the satisfaction of the same Magistrate;

1. The sureties shall affix their photographs and Left Thumb impression in the surety bond and the sureties shall produce copy of any identify proof before the learned Magistrate to ensure their identity;
2. The petitioner/accused is directed to report before the respondent station daily at 10.30 A.M. for 15 days;
3. The petitioner/accused shall not tamper with the witnesses or hamper the investigation in any manner;
4. If there is any breach of conditions, the Investigation Officer shall report to the learned Magistrate and the learned Magistrate shall take appropriate action as if the conditions have been imposed by the Magistrate himself/herself in accordance with the decision ***AIR 2006 S.C. 100 – P.K. Shaji vs State of Kerala.***
