This petition for anticipatory bail coming on this day for hearing before me, M/s.R.Manivel, the learned counsel is appearing for the petitioner/accused and M/s.R.Thirumurugan, the learned Public Prosecutor is appearing for the respondent/complainant, upon hearing both sides and upon perusal of case records, this Court made the following:

ORDER

This petition is filed U/s.482 of B.N.S.S. by the petitioner/accused praying to grant anticipatory bail to the petitioner.

2. The petitioner apprehend arrest at the hands of respondent police for the alleged offences U/s.318(4), 318(1), 319(1), 318(2) of BNS, 2023 in connection with the Cr. No. not known of 20256 of respondent Police Station.

3. Notice given to the Public Prosecutor for the State and the reply

received. Heard both sides; records perused.

4. The learned counsel for the petitioner would submit that, the petitioner is an innocent person, she has no way connected with the said offence; the entire transactions of the defacto complainant are only with the other accused one Kalaiselvi; the petitioner has no role played in the occurrence; moreover, the petitioner is ready to abide by any conditions to be imposed upon her and she is ready to offer substantial sureties before the court and praying to grant anticipatory bail to the petitioner.

5. The learned counsel Public Prosecutor, would submit that **a case in Cr. No.271 of 2026 has been registered against the petitioner for the offence U/s.294(b), 406, 420, 506(i) of IPC.**

6. The learned Public Prosecutor, on the other hand, would strongly object to grant anticipatory bail by stating that this petitioner along with other accused joined hands, got acquaintance with the defacto complainant and induced him and make him to believe that the MCOP case in respect of the death of other accused's husband is pending before the competent court and that the other accused is in need of money thereby received money from him to the tune of Rs.80.15,000/-, thereby the accused have cheated him. He would further submit that the petitioner is arrested in some other cases and also she involved in yet another case thereby PT warrant proceedings has been initiated against her and prays for the dismissal of the petition.

7. It is alleged that, on the pretext of need of money in order to met the MCOP case expenses, the accused have received money from the defacto complainant thereby, deliberately cheated him to the tune of

Rs.80,15,000/-. It is pleaded by the learned Public Prosecutor that the petitioner has been arrested in some other cases and also she involved in yet another case thereby PT warrant proceedings has been initiated against her, which revealed the previous antecedents of the petitioner. It is submitted by the prosecution that the investigation is only at the preliminary stage, if she released on bail, he will tamper with the evidences. Taking into consideration the gravity of the offence, nature of allegations levelled against the petitioner, previous antecedents of the petitioner/accused, the amount involved is huge, the swindled amount is not yet recovered, the investigation seemed to be at the preliminary stage and also considering the overall facts and circumstances of the case, this court is not inclined to grant anticipatory bail to the petitioner, at this stage. **Accordingly, this petition is dismissed.**
