This petition for bail coming on this day for hearing before me, M/s.K.Anbarasu, the learned counsel is appearing for the petitioner/accused and of M/s.R.Thirumurugan, the learned Public Prosecutor is appearing for the respondent/complainant, upon hearing both sides and upon perusal of case records, this Court made the following

O R D E R

This petition is filed U/s.483 of BNSS 2023, seeking to enlarge the petitioner on bail.

2. The petitioner/accused is facing charges for the alleged offences U/s.126(2), 296(b), 309(4), 311, 324(4), 125, 351(3) of BNS, 2023.

3. Notice given to the Public Prosecutor for the State and the reply received. Heard both sides; records perused.

4. The learned counsel for the petitioner/accused would submit that

the petitioner is falsely implicated in this case; he was arrested and remanded on 14.02.2026 and he is under judicial custody for the past 116 days; moreover, the petitioner is ready to abide by any conditions to be imposed upon him and he is ready to offer substantial sureties before the Court, thereby praying for enlargement on bail.

5. The learned Public Prosecutor, on the other hand, would submit that on the occurrence day, the petitioner along with other accused have came into the defacto complainant's fruit shop, picked up quarrel with him by demanding money, tried to attack him with knife, robbed a sum of Rs.700/- from him at knife point, threatened him with dire consequences and fled away. He would further submit that in this case, after completion of investigation charge sheet has been filed before the learned Judicial Magistrate.

6. It is seen the occurrence has taken place on 14.02.2026 and the accused is in custody from the same day. Total period of custody exceeds 116 days. It is submitted by the learned Public Prosecutor that investigation has been completed and Final Report has been filed before the learned Judicial Magistrate. Under such circumstances, this court is of the considered view that keeping the petitioner/accused in prison will not serve any purpose for the investigating agency. Taking into consideration the duration of custody and also considering the facts and circumstances of the case, this court is inclined to grant bail to the petitioner/accused.

7. In the result, this petition is allowed; The petitioner/accused is ordered to be released on bail on his execution of bond for Rs.10,000/- with two sureties for a like sum to the satisfaction of the learned Judicial Magistrate No.I, Alandur, with further conditions that;

1. The sureties shall affix their photographs and Left Thumb Impression (LTI) in the surety bond and the sureties shall produce copy of any identity proof before the learned Magistrate to ensure their identity;
2. The petitioner/accused is directed to report before the learned Judicial Magistrate No.I, Alandur daily at 10.30 A.M. for 30 days;
3. The petitioner/accused should not tamper with the evidence either during investigation or trial;
4. The petitioner/accused shall not abscond either during investigation or trial;
5. If there is any breach of conditions, the Investigation Officer shall report to the learned Magistrate and the learned Magistrate shall take appropriate action as if the conditions have been imposed by the Magistrate himself/herself in accordance with the decision in ***AIR 2006 SC 100 - P.K. Shaji Vs State of Kerala.***
