This petition for anticipatory bail coming on this day for hearing before me, M/s.E.Sundararajan, the learned counsel is appearing for the petitioner/accused and of M/s.V.Krishnamoorthy, the learned Public Prosecutor is appearing for the respondent/complainant, upon hearing the arguments and upon perusal of case records, this Court made the following:

O R D E R

This petition is filed U/s.482 of B.N.S.S. to grant anticipatory bail to the petitioner.

2. The petitioner apprehend arrest at the hands of respondent police for the alleged offences U/s.296(b), 118(1), 351(3) of BNS, 2023 in connection with the Cr. No.289 of 2026 of respondent Police Station.

3. Notice given to the Public Prosecutor for the State and reply received. Heard both sides and perused the records.

4. The learned counsel for the petitioner would submit that the petitioner is an innocent person, he is no way connected with the said offence; the injured person has been discharged from hospital; moreover the petitioner is ready to abide by any conditions to be imposed upon him and he is ready to offer substantial sureties before the court and praying to grant anticipatory bail to the petitioner.

5. The learned Public Prosecutor, on the other hand, would submit that the petitioner and the defacto complainant are brothers. In continuation to the dispute regarding jewels, the petitioner abused and assaulted the defacto complainant with iron rod thereby caused injuries and also threatened him with dire consequences and prays for the dismissal of the petition.

6. It is submitted by the learned Public Prosecutor that the injured person has been discharged from the hospital, therefore, substantial portion of investigation ought to have been completed by this time. Except the offence U/s.118(1) of BNS, 2023, other offences are bailable in nature. The petitioner seemed to be the first offender, no previous case is pending against him. Taking into consideration of the nature of allegations levelled against the petitioner, relationship between the petitioner and the defacto complainant and also considering of the overall facts and circumstances of the case, this court is inclined to grant anticipatory bail to the petitioner.

7. **In the result, this petition is allowed;** The petitioner, in the event of arrest or on his surrender before the District Munsif cum Judicial Magistrate, Thirukalukundram within 15 days, is ordered to be released on bail on his executing a bond for a sum of Rs.10,000/- with two sureties for a like sum to the satisfaction of the same Magistrate, with conditions that,

1. The sureties shall affix their photographs and Left Thumb Impression (LTI) in the surety bond and the sureties shall produce any one of identity proof before the learned Magistrate to ensure their identity.
2. The petitioner/accused is directed to report before the respondent police station daily at 10.30 A.M. for a period of 15 days;
3. The petitioner should comply with the conditions contemplated U/s.482 (2) (i), (ii) and (iii) B.N.S.S.;
4. The petitioner/accused shall not tamper with the evidences or hamper the investigation in any manner;
5. If there is any breach of conditions, the Investigation Officer shall report to the learned Magistrate and the learned Magistrate shall take appropriate action as if the conditions have been imposed by the Magistrate himself/herself in accordance with the decision *AIR 2006 S.C. 100 – P.K. Shaji vs State of Kerala.*
