This petition has been filed by the petitioner /accused Under section 483
of BNSS praying to grant bail to the petitioner/accused.

This Petition coming on this day for final hearing before this court in the
presence of Thiru.J.Karthikraja, counsel for the petitioner/accused and the
learned Additional Public Prosecutor for the Respondent/Complainant and upon
hearing the both sides arguments, and upon perusal of case records, this Court
made the following:-

ORDER

1. This petition has been filed by the petitioner/accused seeking bail concerned in Cr.No.472/2025 of Tambaram Police Station for alleged offence Under sections 103(2), 126(2), 140(1), 191(2), 191(3), 61(2),351(3) r/w.190 of BNSS Act.

2. The learned counsel for the petitioner/accused submits that the petitioner/ 6th accused was arrested by the respondent police on 01.10.2025 for the alleged offences punishable under Sections 103(2), 126(2), 140(1), 191(2), 191(3), 61(2),351(3) r/w.190 of BNSS Act. He was remanded to judicial custody on 01.10.2025. He further submits that the petitioner has been falsely implicated in the above-mentioned case on the basis of false complaint given by the complainant and is innocent of the alleged offences. The petitioner/accused is law-abiding citizen and will neither tamper with nor hamper the prosecution witnesses. He is ready to furnish solvent sureties that may be imposed upon him. He is ready and willing to abide by any condition imposed by this court and will cooperate with the investigation. The Petitioner/Accused is the sole bread winner of his family and is permanent resident of the above address. The petitioner is does not have any criminal case and will co-operate the trial proceedings. This is the second bail application which was dismissed by this court on 07.07.2026 in CrI.M.P.No.2246/2026. No similar petition is pending

before any other court including the Hon'ble High Court of Judicature, Madras and prays to grant bail to the petitioner.

3. The learned Additional Public Prosecutor after filing the written objection of the Inspector of Police, T1 Tambaram Police station submitted that, as per reply of the Respondent/police, he submits that the deceased Vinothkumar had a dispute with the Ambedkar Auto Stand Union members especially with A1, Rajesh @ Laddu Rajesh and his friend in the Union. Due to which A1 to A6 conspired and murdered Vinothkumar. The petitioner/ 6th accused was remanded to judicial custody on 01.10.2025 and is currently in prison. If the accused is released on bail, he could issue threats, tamper with evidence, or face harm himself. Furthermore, as there is a risk of the accused engaging in similar acts of murder or other crimes, he strongly objected the petition.

4. Heard. Records perused.

5. This court has considered the submissions of the respective sides. On perusal of case records, it reveals that the petitioner/ 6th accused is in Judicial Custody from 01.10.2025 and this is the second bail application. This Sessions case is in the stage of opening of prosecution and the petitioner/ 6th accused is in judicial custody for more than nine months. However, having regard to the facts and circumstances of the case, it is noticed that the petitioner/ 6th accused has already been detained under the Goondas Act. Further, the accused appears to be a habitual offender. Considering above facts and circumstances of this case

and the gravity of the offence and also the serious objections raised by the learned Additional Public Prosecutor, this court is not inclined to allow the petition and accordingly this petition is dismissed.

In the result, this petition is dismissed.
